Feast of the Assumption of Mary Luke 1:39-56



'Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." And Mary said: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me and holy is his Name. He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm, and has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

Assumption of BlessedMother- 20th Sunday Ordinary Time Year B

If we were only counting weeks in the liturgical year, this would be the 20th Week in Ordinary Time, yet when we look at the specific date, August 15th, we happen upon the Annual Feast of the Blessed Mother's Assumption into Heavenly Glory. Such High Feast Holy Days replace the normal prayers/readings with the special Holy day readings (so we will miss the 2nd to last reading from John's Bread of Life Teaching we've been hearing the last four weeks-it is 6:51-58). So we can just 'wrap up' Jn 6:51-58 to taste more a little later. Next week, we will finish the Bread of Life series.

But today we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Mother, body & soul into the glory of heaven at the time of her passing (or going to sleep in Christ) here on earth. Such glorious transports to heaven are mentioned in the OT, for Elijah who was dramatically 'taken up' in a fiery chariot (2 Kings 2:11) or even Enoch who was simply 'taken by God' humbly without event (Genesis 5:24). In Jerusalem, there is a Shrine Church of the Sepulchre of Saint Mary (her supposed burial site), at foot of Mt of Olives, yet it is empty. Early Church tradition holds that it was found empty on the third day (& later bishops sought her relics there too, but never found a body-only her cloth cincture). Our belief is that God preserved her (who was the bodily tabernacle giving birth to the Living Christ) body from the natural decomposition process by taking her on home-body & soul (like Elijah!). Such would be a fitting reward for such a humble servant handmaid of the Lord.

I love Mary's prayer of God's praise today in our gospel reading (Luke 1:46-55). We call it the 'Magnifeat' from its opening words, "My soul magnifies the Lord'. Mary offers a list of thanks and consequent praises to God for various blessings she has witnessed or received. I find a pattern in her prayer, that the more humbly we praise God, then the more God will lift us up. (Sound familiar? Jesus echoes her later with His "the least among you is the greatest" Luke 9:48 or "Whoever humbles himself will be exalted" Matthew 23:12 or "the last will be first" Matthew 20:16. Mary's devotion and words will later be seen and heard in Jesus Himself. For us, Mary's song of praise offers testimony that God 'hears the cry of the poor and answers' (Psalm 34:7). Mary specifically says God is especially close to the simple, humble and suffering little ones of the world. She says God 'looks upon her lowliness-blessing her' (Luke 1:48), God does 'great things to those who fear him' (1:49-50), God lifts the lowly (1:52), God fills/satisfies the hungry (1:53), and God helps His servant (1:54). I love especially that Mary offers her prayer of praise and glory to God in the middle of all the uncertainty about her unexpected, unusual virgin pregnancy, yet she serves God faithfully and trusts that God will see her through it all for His greater glory! And her situation will only become more uncertain before full clarity comes, so it is her faithful openness to God ('Let it be done to me according to your Word' Luke 1:38) that keeps her close to God. Even after Jesus' birth, her trust will remain on display as she walks 'humbly with her Lord-her Son' through His ministry and death. I think Mary's praise of God is so scripturally rooted that it reveals just how prayerfully versed in scripture and devout as a practicing Jewish maiden Mary was herself. Her prayer sounds just like an ancestor matriarch named Hannah who prayed for help and praised God for His answer in 1 Samuel 2:1-10. Or also like the excerpt of Mariam's Song celebrating God's providential care in Exodus 15:21. For more examples of how scripture is full of songs of God's praise we can refer to the Canticle of Praise of the Three Young Men in Daniel 3:56-88, or nearly any of the psalms! Yet, Mary stands first at the front of the choir in the New Testament singing God's Praises (of course after Gabriel Luke 1:13-17 & 1:30-33, but Gabriel is an angel!). What an example to follow we find in Mary, as a devout and faithful disciple of Christ! Her quickness to praise God, and strong willingness to see God at work within every event and occasion motivates us to follow her example of obedient mindfulness to God's directions in our lives. 
