

- Championship class entries will receive priority in scheduling for Sunday.

CLASS TROPHIES FOR: Classes #6, #8, #9, #10, #12, #14, #16

THOROUGHBREDS HELPING THOROUGHBREDS HIGH POINT AWARD: Thoroughbreds Helping Thoroughbreds (THT) champion and reserve champion awards will be awarded for the SIDC on SATURDAY only. To be eligible, horses MUST have a lip tattoo OR a copy of their Jockey Club papers. Champion receives \$50 in cash, a hand-painted trophy, and a large championship ribbon; reserve receives \$10 in cash and a large reserve ribbon.

Two Levels of the THT award:

#1 Introductory and Training Level – average of two highest scores on Saturday

#2 First level and above – one high score on Saturday

Awards will be presented on Sunday to the Saturday winners.

SIDC SHOW HIGH POINT AWARD – provided by BJ Rubin/Classic Acres

High point ribbons and LEDA logo saddle pads will be given to the ONE single high score of the two-day SIDC at

two levels: Junior High Point – 15 and under, Adult High Point 16 and over.

HIGH POINT PONY AWARD – provided by Hillary Marler

Two High Point Pony champion awards will be based upon the average of two high scores, one from each day of the SIDC. One award will be for Introductory Level and one for Training Level and above. To be eligible, ponies must be at or under 14.2 hands and can be of any breed. Entry form must designate size for consideration for this award.

ENTRIES: Negative Coggins (1 yr.) required; include with entry. **Entries without a Coggins will be assessed an extra \$10 fee.** For out-of-state entrants who need an Illinois entry permit, call 217-782-4946.

FEES: Pay by PayPal at leadyrez@yahoo.com, email entries to same.

Or mail in entry with check – see entry form for details

Class fees: \$20 each class. Additional \$10 fee per championship class entered.

Office fee: \$5 for LEDA members, \$15 for non-members

Late entry fee: \$25 (entry received after Sept. 14)

Entry submitted without a Coggins enclosed will have an additional \$10 office fee added.

Membership dues for LEDA are \$25 senior/\$15 junior. Membership year runs September 1- August 31. You can include membership dues with your entry, or pay online at www.ledadressage.com.

STALLS:

Stalls: \$75/two nights, \$45/one night. NO BEDDING IS INCLUDED WITH STALLS.
Tack Stalls: \$40 two nights, \$25 one night
If working out of horse trailer (no stall): \$15 per day per rider.
All stalls have full doors and are located in the Fairgrounds Show Barn with lighting, power, water.
Please bring hoses for wash racks.

GENERAL SHOW RULES:

One entry form per horse/rider combination PLEASE.

USDF/USEF rules apply except for the following:

Braiding not required.

Hoof boots in lieu of horseshoes are permitted.

Please dress neatly. Leather half chaps that look like tall boots are permitted.

Helmets with a safety harness are required. Safety vests are permitted in the show ring.

Horse/rider combinations are limited to a total of 3 rides per day on Saturday, 2 on Sunday.

CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS RULES:

High-point ribbons and trophies provided by Barbara Wood, owner of New Hanover Farm, <u>www.newhanoverfarm.com</u>.

Rider and owner must be LEDA members when entry is submitted in order to participate in championship classes.

Horse/rider combination can enter only one championship class on Sunday.

Proper show attire is required for championship classes. Please contact show management before the show if this is a hardship for the rider.

Whips are permitted, but readers are NOT permitted.

No bell boots or leg wraps permitted in Championship classes.

Horse/rider pair must enter the highest championship class for which they have qualified on Saturday.

Introductory C Championship

Must complete at least one of the following classes: #5-#9 Training Level Test 3 Championship Must complete at least one of the following classes: #10-#13 First Level Test 3 Championship Must complete at least one of the following classes: #14-#15 Second Level Test 3 and Above Championship Must complete the following class: #16

OTHER INFORMATION:

CLASSES 1/3/4: Any tack, Western or English. Helmet required.

CLASS 1: Test available at <u>www.ledadressage.com</u>.

CLASS 2: Tests available at <u>www.usef.com</u>. Please indicate test level on entry form.

CLASSES 3/4: Indicate tests to be ridden on entry form.

CLASS 6: Limited to first-year horse OR rider in dressage shows.

CLASS 17 Freestyle: Awards for each participant, costumes encouraged. Not judged.

TEST OF CHOICE (TOC) CLASSES: Specify test(s) on entry form. Horse/rider combinations may enter each class more than once.

RIDE TIMES: Tentative schedule will be available on <u>www.ledadressage.com</u> by Sept. 17, 2016. Final schedule will be available Sept. 19. Please ask for ANY changes in classes, schedule, or times by Sept. 18, at 8:00 a.m.

ARENAS: Dressage arena indoors with sand footing. Two sand warm-ups (outdoors) and under pavilion front entrance.

DOGS: Must be leashed at all times. We prefer you leave your pets at home, if possible. Thank you.

PARKING: No parking allowed next to barn. All vehicles must park in designated lot across from barn. Violators subject to tow by fairgrounds personnel.

CAMPERS: Hookups available from fairgrounds operators. Please call Du Quoin Security at 618-542-0474 once you have arrived at the show grounds.

LODGING: Group rate available at Fairgrounds Inn (call 888-542-5001 or 618-542-5000 or visit <u>www.fairgroundsinn.com</u>). Please mention the Southern Illinois Dressage Classic Horse Show.

DIRECTIONS: From North/South I-57: Take Exit #71, Rt. 14, west toward Du Quoin for approx. 15 miles. Turn right on US Hwy. 51 and immediately look for the Coca Cola Bottling plant on the right. Just past the bottling plant, look for a sign for Tracy Lane (just before a "Family Restaurant" on the corner). Turn right onto Tracy Lane and follow it one block to the barn on the right.

From West/East I-64: Turn south onto US Hwy. 51 and follow through Du Quoin (approx. 31 miles). Turn left onto Tracy Lane just past the Family Restaurant and follow it one block to the barn on the right. If you pass Rt. 14, you have gone too far.
