PRIMATE'S CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

"Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name Jesus." Luke 1:30-31

As we celebrate the Feast of the Nativity and Theophany of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, our hearts are filled with holiness and humility, especially when we read the biblical passage about Angel Gabriel's appearance to Mary.

How inspiring is the dialogue between the angel and Mary! This is the moment when God, the Father, chooses the meekest of all to carry in her womb the Savior of the World – Baby Jesus, the Son of God.

Today, the world rejoices as we celebrate Christmas, for we have this blessed gift of once again experiencing the mystery of Christ's incarnation for the salvation of human kind. FEAST OF THEOPHANY/ARMENIAN CHRISTMAS TO BE CELEBRATED

In the Armenian Church, "Armenian Christmas," as it is popularly called is officially celebrated on January 6th and it is a Major Feast Day. Historically, all Christian churches celebrated Christ's birth on January 6th until the fourth century.

Because January 6th falls on a weekday this year, in Yettem we will be celebrating on Sunday, January 8th. Armenian Christmas is a culmination of celebrations of events related to Christ's Incarnation. Theophany or Epiphany (or Astvadz-a-haytnootyoon in Armenian) means "revelation of God," which is the central theme of the Christmas Season in the Armenian Church.

<u>Hokehankist (Requiem Service)</u> – Hokehankist will not be con-ducted during these days because January 8th (The Birth and Revelation of Jesus Christ) is one of the five major celebrations of the Armenian Apostolic Church.

Yughakin – During the Christmas season, it is customary in the Armenian Church for parishioners to make a special offering called Yughakin. Originally, this was to purchase oil to keep the lamps of the church burning brightly. This is now used for the general expenses of the church, again to enable it to continue to provide the light of Jesus Christ.

<u>Flowers/Candles</u> – Anyone wishing to make donations of flowers, poinsettias or candles for the Holy Altar for the Christmas observance may make arrangements through the church office at (559) 528-6892.

<u>Home Blessings</u> – During the Christmas season it is traditional for the parish priest to visit parishioners and conduct a home blessing. If you would like to schedule a home blessing, please call the church office.

PARISH COUNCIL CORNER



This week, we received the sad news of the passing of His Eminence Archbishop Vatche Hovsepian.

In March 1971, His Eminence was elected as the Primate of the Western Diocese of the Armenian Church of North America. During his tenure in the Western Diocese, he established thirteen new parishes and ordained eight priests. In addition, he elevated and inducted hundreds of youth within the Diocese into the Ecclesiastical ranks of Acolyte, sub-Deacon and Deacon.

In 2003, after 32 years of devout, tireless, and reverential service, Archbishop Vatche retired as Primate of the Western Diocese of the Armenian Church of North America.

I'm sure there are many parishes that feel that Vatche Surpazan Hayr had a very special bond with them. But much like parents don't have favorites among their children, Surpazan Hayr shared his love equally among the parishes.

However, when he was with us here in Yettem, he seemed so at home. Who could forget his regular visits at Asdvadzadzin where he would hold up "the little bunches of grapes" and share the significance of the blessing of the grapes? On his way to and from camp every summer we could count on him being in Yettem at least for a short visit if nothing else. He knew us by name and always asked about our children when they moved from the area. At camp he cherished the time he had with the young people and made bonds fishing with them one day and celebrating Badarak together the next. He always knew he had a place to stay near Yettem and never went back down to Southern California without a trunk filled with fruit.

His last visit to Yettem on July 18, 2021, was for the 110th Anniversary of St. Mary Yettem's founding. He went to significant means on that day to secure a driver who drove him here in an old truck many thought would not make it back over the Grapevine. He was determined to be with us for that special event regardless of what others believed to be best for him. As he departed that day, he shared how it was difficult for him to be here because so many of his cherished friends had departed this world and he felt sad without them here.

I also imagine he most likely knew this could be his last visit to *this* Garden of Eden.



The Feast of the Nativity and Theophany reminds us of God's divine intervention in our lives, so that we may reflect upon it and humble ourselves to receive God's grace as did Mary, the Mother of God. With the birth of Jesus Christ, the mystery of salvation is revealed to us, which is the greatest gift to humanity.
