**Parking over the sidewalk or on the grass** is not permitted within the City of Sugar Land. This becomes a hazard for people and children who have to walk into the street to go around your vehicle. This is a ticketable offense! Vehicles parking in cul de sacs or parked in streets in such a way that prohibit emergency vehicles from responding to an emergency, will typically be ticketed or towed. So before you park a big truck across the street from another big truck, make sure there is enough room for a firetruck to pass between the two vehicles to respond to an emergency! Clean out your garages so at least one car may be parked inside.

**October is Fire Safety Month** - Way back in October of 1917, a fire broke out in the O'Leary family barn. Although the cause of the fire was never proved, it was traditionally blamed on Mrs. O'Leary's cow. October has become Safety Awareness Month, and in observation, the City is hosting its annual Open House on **Saturday October 8, 2016** from 10am-2pm at Fire Station #7 (1301 Chatham Avenue in New Territory). **Political signs** will soon be popping up everywhere in support of the Presidential Election. Before you place a sign on your property, please review the following Property Code § 202.009 to make sure you are in compliance:

1.Residents may display standard campaign signs from 90 days before an election through 10 days after the election.

2.Signs must be ground mounted.

3. Residents may not display more than one sign for each candidate or ballot item.

4.Signs may not:

•contain roofing material, siding, paving material, flora, balloons or lights, or any other similar building, landscaping, or nonstandard decorative component;

•be attached in any way to plant material, a traffic control device, a light, a trailer, a vehicle, or any other existing structure or object;

•include the painting of architectural surfaces;

•threaten the public health or safety;

•be larger than four feet by six feet;

•violate a law;

•contain language, graphics, or any display that would be offensive to the ordinary person; or

•be accompanied by music or other sounds or by streamers or is otherwise distracting to motorists.

## Marion's Fishing Corner



This tim e of year, it's hip to be square.....

Gamefish behavior can be tough to predict this time of year. With water temps where they are, fall patterns haven't

fall patterns haven't really taken hold yet. Trying to find fish that are in a feeding mode is still very much a hit-or-miss proposition this month.The best way I know to help increase your odds of contacting active fish is to use a bait that allows you to cover more water. And the best tool for this approach? The squarebill crankbait.

Squarebills normally dive only about two or three feet deep, which make them very effective for this presentation. A 1.5 or 2 inch squarebill crankbait is great for quickly cranking the shade pockets along the bulkheads this time of year. The more water you cover in a day's time, the more fish are likely to see your lure. A majority of the fish you contact will probably be on the smallish side, but when you are fishing for fun, a bite is a bite. Also, it's a nice change of pace from slowly dragging a worm through offshore brushpiles. The worm still works for larger bass, but we are talking numbers here. And as the season progresses, the squarebill bite will just get better. So if you are like me and just want more bites during the day, regardless of the size of the fish, get crank'in! These shallow running baits are the best tool I know of to help make good things happen for you on the water this month.

Always remember to catch and release. It's the future of our lake.

## What To Do About Those Mosquitoes

The Houston area has officially been ranked third in the nation as the city with the worst mosquito problems. Here's what you can do to reduce the amount of mosquitoes in your yard:

• Remove standing water -This is one of the most important things you can do. Standing water is a major contributor to mosquito problems. Because it is where adult mosquitoes typically lay their eggs. Make sure you remove standing water from bird baths, ponds, outdoor storage areas and small swimming pools.

• Check EVERYTHING! -Mosquitoes like to get tricky. So spots that you wouldn't even expect mosquitoes to reside are still major potential breeding grounds. This includes old tires, children's sandboxes, dog bowls, grill covers, tarps, old firewood, and even plant/flower pots. What do all these secret hiding spots have in common? They can hold leftover excess water. This also means that your gutters are one of the most troublesome hot spots for mosquitoes. Make sure to clean them regularly and often; especially after it rains.

• Take care of your yard -Mosquitoes love to inhabit cool areas with shade. This means you can usually find them hiding under plant leaves and in tall grass. A properly maintained yard, free of weeds and overgrown plants can be a huge help in reducing the number of mosquiquito problem in the area.

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

WELCOME TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD Moving is hard: With all the logistical considerations of buying the home, closing, moving out of the






