Project Description:

The Standing Stone Team conducted a comprehensive all hazard threat, vulnerability and risk analysis of the St Elizabeth (former mental hospital) Campus for the proposed new Coast Guard and DHS Headquarters.



Site visits and meetings with key stakeholders from GSA, Coast Guard Command, Homeland Defense, and others were held as part of the threat, vulnerability and risk assessments. The risks associated for each of the five proposed building sites on the campus were identified as part of the feasibility, architectural and engineering decision making process. This analysis included security design reviews of proposed architectural concepts for the Headquarters building, associate supplementary facilities , entrances, exits, parking as well as on-site security assessments of existing Saint Elizabeth's facilities (many historical).

Design feasibility charrettes and presentations were conducted to present findings and develop design concepts for the campus. The Standing Stone team provided the security and emergency response pros and cons for each of the proposed designs.
