<u>Cold Weather</u>: Please send you child to school with a coat, hat, & gloves on cold days, so that they will stay warm during outdoor recess.

<u>Scantron:</u> Mid-Year Scantron testing for students in Grades K-8 will take place during the week of **Jan. 17-20**. Please be sure your child is well rested and has a healthy breakfast on testing days, and avoid scheduling doctor appointments during testing times.

<u>Pre-K Info Day</u>: We will be having an Info Day for parents interested in our Pre-K program for the 2017-18 school year on **Wed**, Jan. 25 from 8-10am. Please encourage any interested friends and family to visit.

<u>Re-Registration & Admissions:</u> Re-Registration for the 2017-18 school year opens **Jan. 29**. Current families will receive an email from OLSS/TADS with instructions on enrolling. Admissions for new families opens **Feb. 12**.

Open House: We will be having an Open House on **Wed, Feb. 1 from 9-11am**. Please encourage interested friends and family to visit. Volunteers are needed to help greet visitors and help give tours; please sign up through the school website if you are able to help.

<u>Youth Rally:</u> Middle School students will be attending the Youth Rally & Mass for Life in Washington, DC on Jan. 27 with OLSS Youth Minister, Joanne Pensenstadler. Permission forms and info will be sent home in the next week. This field trip is optional; however, if students do not wish to go, they are expected to attend school that day. If you will be attending the Youth Rally with your children in PK-Grade 5, please notify your child's teacher. They will be allowed an excused absence from school that day.

Inclement Weather Reminder: OLSS follows the inclement weather decisions of Calvert County Public Schools, who post their decisions on cancellations and delays on their website by 5:30am. OLSS will also send an email notification through School Messenger to notify parents if we will have a delayed opening or cancellation.

<u>Health Policies</u>: With cold and flu season upon us, we would like to remind parents of our health policies. Following these important health rules will reduce the risk of spreading illness to others:

- While sick, a person is contagious at least 24 hours before becoming symptomatic, and at least 24 hours after recovering from the symptoms of a virus. Children who come to school while ill, and return to school too soon after being ill, put all of our children and staff at risk of catching illness.
- If your child has had a fever, vomiting, and/or diarrhea, please keep them home during, and for at least 24 hours after their symptoms have subsided.
- Students must be fever-free without the use of medications for 24 hours before returning to school.
- Students may not bring any medication to school. If medication (including over-the-counter) must be administered during the school day, a Student Medication Authorization form must be completed by a physician, signed by a parent, and submitted to the School Office with the medication.
