
St. Pins Tenth CATHOLIC CHURCH

Bread of Life Series

July 25, 2021

John 6:1-15

What are we called to offer? Just as there seemed to be an insufficient amount of food in today's Gospel, we are reminded that Jesus is who supplies the abundance if only we give him what little we may have. What does this mean in the everyday life of a disciple today? The Eucharist is our source (beginning) and summit (end), which tells us that if we are to be effective at offering anything, we must begin and end our day with Jesus in prayer. This is where we will find our abundant offering when the opportunity to share comes our way throughout the day, whether that is as small on your part as sharing a smile with a stranger, or as big as sharing your love for Christ to someone in need. The Lord will provide if you make him your source and summit. Please join in prayer for these five weeks as all the parishes of our diocese reflect on the Bread of Life discourse and deepen our experience of the Eucharist.


