Ministry Areas

With the new church year beginning in late November, the area of worship was non stop busy. For three Wednesdays we held Advent services using the meditative Holden Evening Prayer. The Fourth Sunday of Advent was also Christmas Eve. We finished the blue of Advent celebrating Mary the Mother of Jesus at our 10:15 AM service, then transitioned into the white of Christmas Eve with one 6:30 PM Candlelight Service. In January we worshiped with a Polka Service, then moved into February with a special service of healing. After Transfiguration Sunday, Lent began. Ash Wednesday began with Pastor Chris and Vicar Daniel took ashes to SNRC residents, where they joined Father Joseph of the Catholic Church in distributing ashes. Two services for Ash Wednes-

day included Holy Communion. Wednesday Lenten Services began February 21 with the theme "Guided to the Cross," a thirty minute service with communion that begins at noon.



Our Wednesday evening GIFT program, Growing in Faith Together, continues to thrive and grow. Some weeks over 90 youth and adults come for a meal and participate in classes. Other adults prepare, serve, and clean up after the meal. It is a joy and a challenge, since classrooms are overflowing as new children show up and are fed and welcomed. The GIFT Christmas program "One Night In Beth-

lehem" was adapted so that all those interested could join in telling the story for worship on Sunday December 17. New this year was a GIFT Christmas party with a meal, games, and a large group story. Meanwhile our three adults classes also thrived, with Vicar Daniel teaching Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights, and Pastor Chris teaching each Wednesday morning.





The Caring Ministries work at helping others. In December the Giving Tree Project gathered 75 gift that went to large needy families identified by Shiner ISD. Christmas cards were addressed and sent to the elderly and homebound. Ongoing behind-the-scenes ministries such as soup for the ill, grief support, and Home Touch publications all are used as

needed. Hands & Hearts Prayer Shawl Ministry continues to craft comforting shawls for those in need. The hard working hospitality team represented our congregation at Christmas in the Park and hosted receptions for the GIFT Christmas program, the Family Christmas Hayride, and a baptism. As a part of Caring Ministry, receptions following funerals were hosted with volunteers providing desserts or entire meals. Anyone who donated time or food in these events is actually contributing as part of our Caring Ministries.



Connecting includes supporting fellowship and outreach events. Our congregation participated in Christmas in the Park, reaching out to the Shiner Community. Ongoing groups such as canasta, dominoes, men's and women's fellowships, all are open to the Shiner community. The Family Christmas Hayride encouraged family participation. An-

other targeted group is JOY, Just Older Youth, that reaches into the retired community. JOY met in both December and February, enjoying fellowship and fine home cooked meals. A quarterly Women's Bible Study gathered in December and included a salad luncheon following their study. A Hearty Party & Dance was held for junior & senior high students and friends on Friday February 9 from 7-9 PM. Youth enjoyed treats and eats while enjoying the music, playing games, and appreciating the special decorations.

During the past three months, Church Council has acted to consider and complete various actions.

December meeting: Elected officers; Set Installation of Council for January 7, 2024; Determined that beginning in February, Quarterly Connections will be primarily sent electronically. Individuals Souncil without computer access may request a print copy. Some print copies will also be available for pick up at church.

January meeting: Appointed Kim Zaruba, Rae Nell Janik, and Phyllis Pietsch to the Audit Committee to audit the church books as well as Cub Scout Pack 231; Determined which council members would serve on Mission Groups: Worshiping (Brian Baker & Mike Vaughan); Learning (Michele Pokluda & Holly Heinsohn); Caring (James Davis & Duncan Wallace); Connecting (Sanday Blum & Randy Zaruba) and Support (Shannon Blaschke & Eric Winkenwerder).

February Meeting: The 2024 Scholarship Committee will need to be appointed at the March council meeting; May 15th @ 6:00 PM will be the next Mission Group meeting; As of June 2024, we will no longer be insured by Church Mutual. Randy Zaruba will research possible alternatives; Security cameras were discussed as being useful for our facility. The discussion & research of this proposal has been tabled to the Property Committee.



Our Mission Groups of Worshiping, Learning, Caring, Connecting and Supporting meet at least twice a year. Since the Leadership Retreat was scheduled in January and Lent came early this year, the first 2024 Mission Group meeting is scheduled for Wednesday May 15, 2024. This meeting gives an opportunity for all areas of ministry to look beyond their own specific goals and see the larger view of our place in the Shiner community and beyond.



On Saturday January 13 a Leadership Retreat was held at the El Shaddai Retreat Center near Yorktown. Anyone interested in the life and health of our congregation was invited to participate. Over 20 leaders traveled to El Shaddai, worshiped together, shared a meal, and spent three sessions discussing our congregation and its vitality and sustainability. Participants better understood our congregation's path.



On January 30, 2024 one of our two Semi-Annual Congregational Meetings was held following the Sunday worship service. The main item of business was to review and accept the 2023 Annual Report, copies of which had been made available prior to the meeting... The motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the 2023 Annual Report. Likewise, the minutes from the November Congregational Meeting were approved. The next scheduled congregational meeting will be in November of 2024.

Giving



The Planned Giving Campaign ran from September 17 through October Planned Giving 30, 2023. This effort was made to insure funds were available for the next three years of mortgage payments along with 18 months of pay-

ments to be held in reserve. Our goal was \$475,000 in donations and planned giving. Our goal was met and the Finance Team is now looking at guidelines to start paying down on the loan principal. Individuals are asked to honor their commitments as we continue with our

planned giving throughout the life of the building loan. Any and all contributions are appreciated!

Four ways to give your offerings and other gifts to your church:



Traditional giving is through offerings. On our church envelopes, giving can be designated to General Fund (operating expenses), Building Fund (mortgage payments), Endowment Fund (long term investments), Improvement Fund (facility projects and repairs), or other specific needs that you specify. New pew envelopes are in the pew pockets if you forget yours. Remember many households give monthly rather than weekly, and others give electronically, so good attendance does not always mean substantial giving for the week.



Mailing in your offering to P.O. Box 26, Shiner TX 77984 is always an option. Some faithful givers may prefer to give their envelopes in this way. Others give by mail because their connection to our congregation is through our livestreamed services, and they do not live in Shiner.



Online giving is an option for those with computer access. Gifts can be by bank transfer, credit or debit card. If giving by credit card, there is a choice to give a few dollars more to cover card fees. Online giving can designate funds (like General or Building) and can be given once, by your schedule, weekly, monthly, or yearly. To give online go to www.shinerlutheran.org, our website, and click on Connect/Give to get a direct link to our VANCO electronic giving platform.



Texting is also a way to give electronically. Text to 1-844-697-3838, specify an amount and give through a credit or debit card. Choices are similar to online giving.— and it can even be done during worship if you so choose. All gifts count!



We were blessed in December by special end of year giving that helped to bring us to a good financial position at the conclusion of 2023. Planned Giving Commitments were met in the first months after the Planned Giving Campaign. Memorials were dedicated to both the Building Fund and to the Memorial Fund. We have been blessed by generosity.



Noisy Offerings are gathered on the last Sunday of the month. The Caring Mission Group determines the recipients of the offering. The December offering of \$176.25 was dedicated to our Camper Fund.
