

"Welcomed Conversations"

Don't you love answering your phone for tele-marketers or robocalls? Don't you look

forward to those calls while you are eating dinner or taking a nap? No? Neither do I. They are too impersonal, manipulative, and annoying.

Jesus commissioned us to invite others to follow him. There is no greater message that we get to communicate to the world than the Gospel. And there are 3 basic ways to do that:

- 1. Robocall we could offer a scripted and impersonal plea to random strangers.
- 2. Telemarketer we could offer a tactical strategy that seeks only to make a sale.
- 3. Neighbor we could offer a friendly conversation with someone with whom we already have a relationship.

To which call are YOU most receptive? We are surrounded by neighbors who may reject "organized religion", but can be very receptive to a relationship with Jesus. As the Church, our mission is not to manipulate people into following Jesus. We are to demonstrate the love of God and communicate the truth of God. As we love our neighbors and build relationships with them, they can see the light of Christ in us. And that opens the door for welcomed conversations rather than a sales pitch.

Conduct a simple experiment to illustrate Easter's meaning.



What you need:


- White carnations
- Scissors
- Vase
- Water
- · Red food coloring
- · Bible

What you do:

- Cut the carnation stems (at an angle) to about 8 inches long.
- Fill the vase halfway with water. Add 10 drops of food coloring. (More may be needed to darken the water.)
- Add the cut flowers and observe what happens to the petals over time.
- Discuss how this is like Jesus' work on the cross.
 Read 1 Peter 2:22-24 (NIV) and reflect on what his death means for us.
- To learn more about this experiment, research capillary action.

The Post Office now has a site where you can sign up and each morning you will receive an email letting you know what will be delivered that day. This includes any packages (not amazon or fedex) just USPS.

Go to <usps.com/statefarmid> and sign up now.

You will be able to

*check your mail from anywhere on your smartphone, computer or tablet.

*Track incoming packages

*Interact with your mail and packages on a secure online dashboard.

This may not solve all of your missing mail problems but it sure does help. I, personally, get an email each morning and know exactly what my mail carrier is suppose to deliver to me that day.

All you have to do is sign up and remember to check email.


