# Message from the Mayor

The village has been trying to get fiber to our town for several years now. When we thought we were close, there was a breakdown, not on our end but the companies.

Wabash Communications is looking to bring fiber to Strasburg. You say, "heard that before". You are right! Wabash was formally Illinois Fiber Connect, which was a coop with EJ Water. Wabash and EJ are no longer together. We are starting over again.

Residents will get an interest survey sheet in the February Sewer bill to return indicating your interest in fiber. Wabash will also be at the Pancake Breakfast on February 25 with information. Again, we need enough people to sign up with Wabash. The problem is that Wabash is competing with Consolidated and Mediacom, which means residents need to look at their service, the speed of their internet and determine if they want faster and more reliable service. Only so much data can be transferred with the lines we currently use.

To attract younger families to our community, we need faster internet. These families are using the internet to work from home, for school and for streaming TV shows and movies.

The flyer lists different packages that you can sign up for. We need to hear from all households whether you are interested or not. Wabash will visit those addresses that do not return the interest survey. The longer it takes to get the surveys back the longer it will take for Wabash to decide if it is to their benefit to come to Strasburg. Your cooperation in this matter is needed for us to move forward.

FLUSHABLE WIPES! Unfortunately, you can't flush them!! We have had to repair a pump at our sewer lift station twice in the past 6 weeks due to flushable wipes! They clog everything up.
