God's Word is Seed - Part IV By Wade Anderson

Let's pray: "Heavenly Father, as I share Your written Word I pray believing that Your Spirit, Sir, will begin to open the blind eyes and open the ears of Your children to see and hear Your love for each of them. Holy Spirit, I thank You for pouring the love of God out over these written words, that they are received with our love as well. I thank You, Lord, that Your Word tells us there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. I know that You hold all Your children close to You, Holy Spirit help them to understand that there is no condemnation in any of what is written here. Your Word is the only real truth, so I invite Your Holy Spirit to be the Teacher here on these pages, always. In Jesus name I pray and believe for the restoration of Your bride. Amen! Amen! And Amen!"

Years ago, I wrestled with the message God was giving me about tithing. Having been inside those walls and fences myself 'I thought I understood' the value of every cent made there and how little it produced. Notice in quotes 'I thought I understood'. But honestly, the only understanding I had was a human understanding. As God kept laying tithing on my heart I reasoned with Him, saying, "But God, I know how little these brothers and sisters have and how they stretch what little they do get. God, I'm pretty sure that if I put a tithe message in the newsletter some of them will write us and say, 'We wondered how long it was going to take before you started asking for our money!"

As I finished my reasoning with God, I felt Holy Spirit rise up on the inside of me and say, "Duck, (yes He calls me Duck) why is it that you will share everything else from My Word except the one place I tell people they can test Me? Look what I've done in your own life through your obedience to tithe. Give the people the opportunity to hear what I promise them. It's up to each individual whether they choose to obey Me or not." Immediately I repented for thinking 'I thought I understood' better than God.

From our own tithing, I DID understand that it wasn't about the amount, but about the obedience. God doesn't need our money; His streets are paved in gold. What He desires more than anything is for our hearts to respond to every area of His teaching. Here, in Luke 21:1-4 (NLT), are Jesus' words about this very thing, "While Jesus was in the Temple, He watched the rich people dropping their gifts in the collection box. Then a poor widow came by and dropped in two small coins. I tall you the truth," Jesus said, 'this poor widow has given more than all the rest of them. For they have given a tiny part of their surplus, but she, poor as she is, has given everything she has." The New King James Version renders these same verses as this, "And He looked up and saw the rich putting their gifts into the treasury, and He saw also a certain poor widow putting in two mites. So He said, "Truty I say to you that this poor widow has put in more than all; for all those out of their abundance have put in offerings for God, but she out of har poverty put in all the Itrallical that she had." Watching my grandparents, up to my teenage years, I'd seen how their lives were always blessed. My grandfather always worked hard, and they always had more than enough. In fact, they always had enough to sponsor several orphans AND still help our family and our cousin's family. The foundation of their success wasn't only because my grandfather worked hard. Their obedience to His promise was the foundation of their success and a perfect example for us to learn from.

Once I surrendered in obedience to write that article Holy Spirit has moved in the hearts of a group of you, and right this minute in front of me there are a half a dozen pieces of mail with tithes in them. Overall, there are over a dozen consistent tithers with another dozen occasional givers. Believe me when I say there is no condemnation in what I've just said. Before I even wrote the message Holy Spirit had already been moving in these people's hearts, they just needed direction to where to be obedient. Even though this is not a tithe message I'm pretty confident that if you were to ask any of us that do take God at His Word in this area, the seam of thread that would run through all of our testimonies is that GOD IS FAITHFUL! And again, this is not a tithe message BUT if Holy Spirit is moving in your heart about this topic, it's only because He wants your heart, not your money. And one of the ways to show God that He has your heart is through your tithing. Go ahead, test Him on this, give Him the opportunity to open the windows of heaven in YOUR life like He does in our lives. Let's move on.

In Ephesians 4:1-3, Paul is talking to us about "Unity in The Body". He begins by stating, "I, a prisoner for serving the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of your calling, for you have been called by God. Always be humble and gentle. Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults because of your love. Make every effort to keep yourselves united in the Spirit, binding yourselves together with peace." When I read these verses and many others like them, I do so by looking directly into God's mirror, His written Word, to see that I'm not fooling myself with the things I'm saying or writing. In the forefront of my thoughts and actions, I do my best to remember what Paul said, "It wasn't that long ago you too lived as the world lives." (My paraphrase of Ephesians 2:2)

Brothers and sisters, like Paul, I did not choose to do what God has called me to do today. Although I love and am honored that God HAS called me to this post, my simple mind had a way different idea for what my life would have looked like. My dream and ambitions consisted of working hard towards building custom motorcycles, retiring, then driving in a motorhome with a motorcycle on a trailer, around the United States fishing! Here's the one thing out of all of that state

ment I've not done, and that's retire. Even though I no longer punch a clock for 'the man' God purposely keeps my new life FULL of Kingdom minded vision/missions. Since I was young, I was taught to believe that working hard and then retiring, all worn out, was the American dream. I'm not saying that's a bad thing, except for the worn-out part that is. Working hard is a good thing and it's sad that so many of our younger generation have not been taught this life skill! Instead, so many people in our society today have adopted an 'entitlement mentality'. Retiring, the way I once understood retirement, is not the call God has placed on my life. And to set the record straight, God didn't take all of those things away from me in order for me to do what He has me doing today. Honestly, God has taken those dreams to an even higher level.

I've accomplished 'building custom motorcycles' long ago, and on occasion of my choosing, I still get the opportunity to do so. We are continually taking our grandsons on road trips across the United States in motorhomes and airplanes. Instead of driving to fish, I fly wherever I choose to fish. In fact, God even nudges me to dream of what bucket list fishing trips I'd like to go on. Heck, I didn't even know I had a bucket list until God told me to put things in it! I guess what I'm saying here is, you can put all of your dreams and visions on the same plate with the visions God places inside of you, and as long as you follow God's direction that plate will never be too full to accomplish it all. So, when you feel like there's way too much on your plate, take a step back and evaluate what's on your plate. With frustration of 'time' I still find things on my plate that I had added without consulting with God first.

Scripture clearly states, "God is no respecter of persons," (Acts 10:34) What this means to all of us is this, God sees us all as equals, we ALL are on the same level playing field. And like any good athlete, it all boils down to how bad we truly desire to win for the team. Most all of us know, by heart, Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'" Like I said, most of us can recite this part of His promise believing our future lies in God's hands. But there's an 'our part' in achieving this promise. Now, with open eyes and ears, listen to Jeremiah 29:12-13, "Then you will call on Me and come and pray to Me, and I will listen to you. You will seek Me and find Me when you seek Me with all your heart. You will seek Me and find Me when you seek Me with all your heart." This is what it takes to fully live in all the promises of God. Psalm 37:4 states, "Delight yourself in the LORD; And He will give you the desires of your heart." I want to clarify; this Scripture does not mean that because 'we' delight in God that He will reward us by giving us all of the luxuries that we want, NO! That is not what I was saying in the paragraph above either. However, what it does mean is, when we delight in God, when we focus our hearts on God and His true nature, when we love God with all that we are, THEN the desires of our heart will begin to transform and align with His plans and purpose for each of our lives. Please understand, I am NOT boasting in mine or Michelle's abilities to get where our lives are today. We both know and willingly confess that EVERYTHING we are and have are a direct connection with the goodness of God and His promise, "You will seek Me and find Me when you seek Me with all your heart." (Jeremiah 29:13)

Let me continue on in Ephesians 4:4-6, "For there is one body and one Spirit, just as you have been called to one glorious hope for the future. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all, in all, and living through all." There's that level playing field again. Paul continues with, "However, He has given each one of us a special gift through the generosity of Christ. Now these are the gifts Christ gave to the church: the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, and the pastors and teachers." (Ephesians 4:11) Just like in James 3:1, "Dear brothers and sisters, not many of you should become teachers in the church, for we who teach will be judged more strictly." Many of you have heard God calling you forward, but right here is where you take a step back, "Their responsibility is to equip God's people to do His work and build up the church, the body of Christ." (Ephesians 4:12)

I truly believe one of the reasons many people step back instead of forward to this call is a lack of understanding of who they are IN Christ. What does that mean? When you truly get the revelation of who you are IN Christ all of the "I could never do that", "That's a lot of responsibility", "But that was Jesus", or "That was one of the Apostles" leaves your thought process. It's the revelation of who you are IN Christ and who Christ is in you that helps you realize there's no risk, but instead a sheer boldness rises up inside of you. When God has anointed you to do ANYTING for His Kingdom, you CANNOT fail as long as you remain teachable and follow Him.

Believe this, I know that I am no different than any of you, we've all done some pretty crazy things before we came to know Jesus. And like Paul, "Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:13-14) I guess what I'm getting at is this; When I picked the Bible up and started reading, 16 years ago, I believed God was speaking specifically to me every place I read. It was like I'd been held upside down and shook as everything in the pockets of that life fell out on the ground somewhere! All of the counterfeit things I'd held such a tight grasp on, seemed to have vanished. I knew something inconceivable, at the time, had taken place. Everywhere I turned to read I knew I was being Spirit tutored.

Every prisoner maintains the freedom to choose, and all experience various seasons of adversity. Yet in the midst of every adversity lies a corresponding seed of opportunity. Yet sometimes opportunity 'knocks' by kicking in the door, disturbing my 'house', before running outside to look in the window to see my reaction or my response. My response is my choice, yet I find great opportunity even in the midst of great adversity when I seek with the eyes of grace and the heart of a disciple.

Fifteen years ago, my sins and crimes grievously wounded many people including my stepdaughter. I've had no contact since my arrest. Last year, she participated in a #metoo protest on sexual abuse and was subsequently featured in a Washington Post article. A TV producer with Red Month Media took note and contacted her and interviewed her. The producer has contacted me to get my side of the story, to find out what I've done with my time, what future plans I have, and my thoughts on forgiveness and redemption from a Christian perspective. He also agreed to read the manuscript of my book. It'll be an interesting year!!

Foot's Bible Study

Ezekiel 18:1-20:49

A typical childish response to punishment is to say, "That isn't fair!" In reality, God is fair, but we have broken the rules. It is not God who must live up to our ideas of fairness, instead, we must live up to His. Don't spend your time looking for the loopholes in God's law. Instead, live up to God's standards. (18:25) Not even the political and military might of Judah's kings could save the nation. Like branches of a vine, they would be cut off and uprooted by "the desert wind" – the powerful Babylonian army. (19:11-12)

At the very beginning of Israel's history God clearly warned the people about the consequences of disobedience. See Deuteronomy 28:15. When the people disobeyed, God let them experience those devastating consequences to remind them of the seriousness of their sins. If you chose to live for yourself, apart from God, you may experience similar destructive consequences. However, even though such consequences, God may be drawing you too Himself. Let your misfortunes bring you to your senses and to the merciful God before it is too late. (20:23-24)

Hebrews 9:1-28

The high priest could enter the Most Holy Place (9:3), the innermost room of the Tabernacle, one day each year to atone for the nation's sins. The Most Holy Place was a small room that contained the Ark of the Covenant. The top of the chest served as the "atonement cover" (alter) on which the blood would be sprinkled by the high priest on the Day of Atonement. The Most Holy Place was the most special spot on earth for the Jews and only the high priest could enter it. The other priests and the common people were forbidden to come into the room. Their only access to God was through the high priest, who would offer a sacrifice and use the animal's blood to atone first for his own sins and then for the people's sins. See also 10:19. (9:6-8)

All people die physically, but Christ dies so that we would not have to die spiritually. We can have wonderful confidence in His saving work for us, doing away with sin – past, present and future. He has forgiven our past sin, when He died on the Cross. He sacrificed Himself once and for all. (9:26) He has given us the Holy Spirit to help us deal with present sin. He appears for us now in heaven as our Advocate. (9:24) And He promises to return (9:28) and raise us to eternal life in a world where sin will be banished. (9:24-28)

Psalms 106:32-107:43

This is a beautiful picture of God's great love for His people who deserved only judgement. Fortunately, God's compassion and mercy toward us are not limited by our faithfulness to Him. God was merciful to us in sending His Son to die for our sins. If He did this while we were captive to sin, how much more merciful will He be now that we are His children? (106:44-46)

Those who have never suffered may not appreciate God as much as those who have matured under hardship. Those who have seen God work in times of distress have a deeper insight into His loving-kindness. If you have experienced great trials, you have the potential for great praise. (107:32)

Proverbs 27:10-11

Never give up on your friends or they won't be there for you in your time of need, and you won't have to go to your family, for every little trouble you may have. Be there for your friends so that they'll be there for you. (27:10) A child with wisdom, brings joy to his/her father. (27:11)

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I'll never forget when I first read this in 1 Corinthians 1:26-28, "Remember, dear brothers and sisters, that few of you were wise in the world's eyes or powerful or wealthy when God called you. Instead, God chose things the world considers foolish in order to shame those who think they are wise. And He chose things that are powerless to shame those who are powerful. God chose things despised by the world, things counted as nothing at all, and used them to bring to nothing what the world considers important." You all may think I'm crazy, but right then I stood straight up, and focused my eyes straight ahead. Not with pride, but instead with ownership and a sadness as I realized I'd been a poster child in most of these Scripture examples. For our benefit God made Him to be wisdom itself. Christ made us right with God; He made us pure and holy, and He freed us from sin." (1 Corinthians 1:30) I literally feel the difference between just reading something, and Holy Spirit making a direct statement to me. What rang deep inside of me was, "God has united you with Christ, He has freed you from sin." I'm not saying that I instantly stopped sinning, but I did begin to make different choices of who I hung out with and where I allowed myself to frequent. The way that this became easier and easier was that I intentionally surrounded myself with new likeminded people. When we were in the world we did the same thing, so I knew deep within me that since Christ made us right with God, and I'd switched teams, this new way of life was completely obtainable! Let me assure you that ALL of you can do it as well!

As you too make the choices to separate yourselves to the things of God, it's going to "feel" a bit lonely. But that's just a feeling. Just like temptation isn't sin until you act on the temptation, feelings of loneliness are a counterfeit to the truth that JESUS NOW LIVES on the inside of you! Somebody shout, "PRAISE JESUS!" Now let's read Colossians 2:7,9-10, "Let your roots grow down into Him, and let your lives be built on Him. Then your faith will grow strong in the truth you were taught, and you will overflow with thankfulness. Don't let anyone capture you with empty philosophies and high-sounding nonsense that come from human thinking and from the spiritual powers of this world, rather than from Christ. For IN Christ lives all the fullness of God in a human body. So you also are complete through your union with Christ, who is the head over every ruler and authority." Did you get that? Paul just said, "For IN Christ lives all the fullness of God in a human body. So you also are complete through your union with Christ, who is the head over every ruler and authority." Sure, we can sit under amazing teachers of God's Word, but like Paul, the best Teacher I've sat under has been by revelation of God's Holy Spirit. That's why I always use LOTS of the written Word of God. I hope that you realize these truths in my heart are only there because Holy Spirit has written them there while maintaining an everyday relationship with God in His Word.

"For the sinful nature desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the sinful nature. They are in conflict with each other, so that you do not do what you want." - Galatians 5:17

At no point in our country's history has there been such an epidemic of victimitis as there is today—that is, people who declare themselves powerless against their circumstances, metabolisms, or upbringings. This victim mentality prompts many alcoholics to say, "Drinking problems run in my family—it's genetic. There's really nothing I can do about it." Criminals say, "Look at my upbringing. I never had a chance. It's not my fault." I once spoke with the warden of a federal prison who told me that if he believed the inmates, there wasn't a guilty man there.

Don't create or allow circumstances to develop that can destroy you. Have you accumulated crushing debt? Given in to addiction? Refused to resolve broken relationships? Take responsibility for your life. Don't fall back on excuses like bad luck, bad genes, or bad parents.

Christians aren't exempt from the victim mentality either; we often put another spin on our situation—we blame God for things. The seductive power of the victim mentality is that you never accept responsibility. It's always someone or something else's fault.

I'm not saying your circumstances, genes, and upbringing don't affect who you are. They clearly do. What I'm saying is, regardless of all these things, we remain responsible for our own behavior. And more importantly, God is capable of bringing about change in any life, even yours—no matter how messed up it is.
