Take the **Radio City Music Hall Backstage Tour** at Rockefeller Center. Opened in 1932, the largest theater in the US has an opulent Art Deco interior. Once a movie palace, it now hosts a variety of musical performances and special events, such as the **Tony Awards** and the **MTV Video Music Awards**. The annual **Christmas Show** starring the world famous **Rockettes**, 36 long-legged dancers, is a New York tradition.

8:00 PM Enjoy a concert by the world renowned **Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra with Wynton Marsalis** in the Rose Theater at Lincoln Center. Miles Davis' groundbreaking music from the 1940's-60' is performed, showcasing pivotal musical moments from his long quest toward innovation. Song selections will highlight Davis's popular experiments in bebop, cool jazz, modal jazz, and the avant-garde, as well as the earliest traces of his transition into electric jazz. This music remains enormously popular among both hardcore jazz fans and casual listeners, and this concert will provide new perspective on each creative breakthrough.
The Jazz at Lincoln Center Plays Miles Davis.

9:00 AM Transfer into the city. Comfortable but nice-looking clothes. Jeans/button-downs.

10:00 AM Visit the **National September 11th Memorial and Museum.** This 16-acre site features two enormous waterfalls and reflecting pools, each about an acre in size, set within the footprints of the original twin towers. Its design conveys a spirit of hope and renewal, and creates a contemplative space separate from the usual sights and sounds of a bustling metropolis. With more than 400 trees, the Memorial Plaza is one of the most eco-friendly plazas ever constructed. The Museum serves as the country's principal institution concerned with exploring the implications of the events of 9/11, documenting the impact of those events and exploring 9/11's continuing significance.

- 12:30 PM Transfer to **Grand Central Station** for lunch on your own. One of the world's great rail terminals, is New York's most visited with 500,000 people passing through it daily. It features 15 restaurants and over 40 shops, the New York City Transit Museum and a gourmet food market.

- 3:00 PM Visit the **Intrepid Sea, Air and Space Museum**. Berthed on the mighty Hudson River, The USS Intrepid boasts educational exhibits and exciting events. Building on the long and distinguished history of the aircraft carrier, the Museum provides a glimpse back to a time when the future of the free world hinged on these great ships. Together with the submarine USS Growler and over twenty-five aircraft, including the Space Shuttle Enterprise, visitors are treated to an inside look of life at sea, past, present and future.

- 4:45 PM? Have some time to shop and explore in the **Times Square area**. Known as "The Crossroads of the World" and "The Great White Way," it is one of the most popular commercial intersections in the world! Located in central Manhattan at the junction of Broadway and Seventh Avenue, this popular NYC attraction, is home to top destinations such as **Broadway Theaters, ABC's Times Square Studios**, and the **Ed Sullivan Theater** (home of the **Late Show with Stephen Colbert**).

- 7:30 AM **Breakfast included** at the hotel. Board buses in uniform. Take uniform bags and hangers with change of clothes onto bus.
- 9:00 AM Depart for the staging area.
26th Street at Madison & Fifth Avenues
- Drop off on Madison Avenue between 23rd-25th Streets.*
- 11:11 AM The **Gahanna Lincoln HS Marching Band** performs in the **96th Anniversary Veterans Day Parade**, the oldest and largest parade of its kind, featuring more than 20,000 participants, including veterans of all eras, active duty military, ROTC and JROTC units, civic and youth groups, all accompanied by music performed by top high school bands from around the country. *Parade begins at 25th St and concludes at 46th St.*
- Coaches will meet the group along Sixth Avenue around 52nd Street.*
- A **boxed lunch** will be provided at the conclusion of the parade. Change out of uniform on bus.
- 2:30 PM Meet your guides and depart for an **afternoon sightseeing tour of Manhattan**. The tour will take you to the sites that made the Big Apple famous! The tour will be customized to meet your group's interests, perhaps including such things as: **Lincoln Center, Columbia University, the Dakota and the John Lennon Memorial, "Strawberry Fields" in Central Park, Greenwich Village, and the Financial District** and former site of the **World Trade Center**.
- Conclude your tour at Circle Line Cruises. Coaches need to approach the pier down 43rd Street.*

- 6:00 PM Enjoy your **Festival Awards Dinner/DJ Dance Cruise**, catered by Dallas BBQ, experiencing the New York skyline from the waters of the Hudson River.

7:30 AM **Breakfast included** at the hotel.
Check out of the hotel.

8:30 AM Load coaches for Liberty State Park.

9:00 AM Arrive at **Liberty State Park**. From here you will board the ferries to take you to the **Statue of Liberty** and **Ellis Island**. Visit this monument to freedom and the surrounding area of the island, as well as the Immigration Museum.

You will proceed through airport-type security to go on the ferry to the islands. Please refrain from carrying large bags or metal objects to expedite going through security, and leave any sharp objects (pocket knives, etc.) on the bus.
