Sir:

The above-named applicant has been directed to report to you for examination on account of the disability or disabilities mentioned hereon. If other causes of disability are found on examination, they should be described. Evidences of the results of vicious habits should be sought in every case and reported on.

He has been a pensioner under the general law at \$~~1.00~~, for disability due to *Arteriosclerosis and disease of heart.*

The question to be determined now is whether or not he is unfit or unable to perform manual labor by reason of the above-named disabilities alone.

In order that this Bureau may be in a position to estimate the degree of disability due solely to causes above named, it is essential that you shall describe carefully not only these disabilities, but fully describe each and every disability from which the claimant is suffering, so that all factors entering into the inability to perform manual labor may be known.

State condition of heart, lungs, rectum, nervous system, *bladder, arteries,* and kidneys, prostate.

Give results of urinary analysis.

Describe all similar changes noted. (Page 80.)
Any paralysis, palsy or curvatures of digestive
organs?*
