HOW IS CALIFORNIA DOING?

- There will be 31 ballot measures for voters in 2018.
- Here are a few that voters will be asked to sign:
- A constitutional amendment billed as a "Lockbox" to protect the transportation funding.
- A 2/3 legislative vote needed to spend on cap & trade money.
- A 4 billion dollar bond for park and water infrastructure.
- Exemptions for 55 and older from paying income and property taxes.
- Exemptions from school taxes with no dependent children.
- Allowing convicted felons in prison or on parole to vote.
- Decriminalizing the use of psychotropic mushrooms which may be used for depression and additions.


