

Georgia Public Service Commission is accepting applications for Entry Level and Mid-level PIPELINE SAFETY INSPECTORS

Salary: Entry \$60,000; Mid-level---Commensurate with Education and Experience Recruitment Period: Until Filled Location: Statewide

Duties and Responsibilities: Under limited supervision, performs safety investigations, evaluations and analysis of specialized areas of all natural gas utility operators of distribution, transmission, and LNG (liquefied natural gas) systems in Georgia. Performs investigative techniques beyond the normal scope to determine issues of considerable complexity and sensitivity in natural gas accident investigations for assigned areas. Assists in safety training for operators and the industry concerning natural gas pipeline systems. Responsible for evaluation of natural gas utilities in determining operator compliance with applicable State and Federal safety regulation. Responsible for writing inspection reports and other requested information.

Minimum Training and Experience: a 2- or 4-year degree from an accredited college or university in Engineering or similar discipline; or a minimum of 5 years experience in gas or pipelines, or the enforcement of pipeline safety regulations at the Federal or State level. This experience may include: construction, welding, or fusion of gas pipeline systems; maintenance or repair of gas pipeline systems; or other areas of gas pipeline safety. Applicant should have general knowledge of the construction, maintenance, testing, or repair of gas pipeline systems. Prior State or Federal regulatory experience is preferred.

Exam and Evaluation Information: Selected candidate is required to pass the Federal Training and Qualification courses needed to serve as a lead inspector on standard inspections of gas pipeline systems. This includes progressing through required courses, including all applicable Web-Based Training courses that serve as prerequisites to the required training. These courses include Gas Pressure Regulation, Plastic Materials, Welding Inspection, Pipeline Failure Investigation, Corrosion Control, Federal Code Compliance.

The selected candidate is subject to random drug testing.
