### **Financial Advice for Widow and Widowers**

HEN YOU LOSE A SPOUSE, your world is turned upside down. On top of the grief and loss comes the need to make dozens of decisions about things like the funeral and your life ahead. If your loved one was also the one who handled family finances, the challenges are even greater. Some missteps are almost unavoidable during a major life change such as the loss of a spouse, but here are some things to keep in mind during this tumultuous time.

#### Make Sure You Receive Your Survivor Benefits

Many people who lose a spouse are unaware of the financial benefits to which they may be entitled as survivors. Among these possible sources of income are Social Security, veterans benefits, and private pensions. It's important to find out what benefits are available to you as early as possible so that you can apply for them. It may be difficult to think about this sort of thing during a period of heavy grief, but you risk losing important financial benefits or insurance protection if you fail to complete and file the necessary forms in a timely manner.

#### **Learn to Manage Your Own Finances**

After a lifetime of leaving a spouse in charge of family finances, the loss of that spouse may seem to pose an impossibly difficult, new responsibility, but that need not be the case. Given a little time and help, you can gradually learn to assume at least some of that responsibility yourself.

At first, you will probably feel the need to rely heavily on someone else to help with financial decisions. The choice of who to rely on is crucial. Looking to a friend or family member is the easiest solution to this problem; however, unless that person has financial credentials, it usually isn't the wisest choice to rely on that person alone. Today's financial world is complex and rife with costly pitfalls-ones that can easily trap a well-intentioned amateur. If your family finances and investments are complex, you may want to engage a financial professional who can help with your learning process and teach you how to supervise the handling of your financial affairs. In time, you can learn to be an active partner in your financial decisions.

The first place to look for professional assistance is from financial professionals who are already familiar with your family's

finances, for example an accountant who has worked on the family taxes; however, not all professionals will be ready and able to provide a full range of financial advice. For example, many accountants choose to restrict their work to narrow areas such as taxes and lack the experience to help with comprehensive financial planning.

Another possible source of help is your local bank. Many banks have departments that specialize in giving financial advice. One advantage in looking to your local bank is their ready knowledge of your family's financial status and recent transactions. If, however, the person with whom you would be dealing is not a Certified Financial Planner or other credentialed financial expert, you would probably do better to enlist the help of a professional financial advisor.

There are a number of resources available to help you find such a financial professional. For example, if you are looking for a certified public accountant, the National Directory of Certified Public Accountants (www.cpadirectory.com) makes the search easy. Just enter your zip code and you will get a listing of CPAs in your area along with their contact information.

You also may want to consider someone with additional training, such as a Certified Financial Planner who specializes in family finances. Help in finding a planner who is suited to your needs is available from the Financial Planning Association's website (www.plannersearch.org). Like the National Directory of Certified Public Accountants, the Financial Planning Association's website also allows you to find local professionals by entering your zip code. It also provides links that can help you to choose a Certified Financial Planner who is appropriate to your needs.

#### **Don't Leave Your Finances Alone Forever**

If your spouse's management of your family finances met with reasonable success, it may seem logical to maintain a hands-off policy for the future and not second-guess any of those decisions. But while the choices your spouse made

may have reflected your needs and the market's conditions at the time he or she made them, your needs may change and so may the economic environment. Whether you are going it alone or working with a trusted advisor, it's important to monitor your investments to make sure that they reflect the demands of the constantly changing financial landscape.

#### Seek Advice before Making **Major Changes**

As a surviving spouse, you will quickly find yourself facing important business and personal decisions. Should I sell the house and move to an apartment? Should I agree to move to

another city to be near one of the children? Should I sell the family business or try to keep it running?

At the same time, particularly during the first year or so, emotional upheavals can play havoc with your ability to make rational decisions. The loss of a spouse is a time when you are especially vulnerable and potentially willing to listen to anyone who makes what sound like reasonable suggestions. Whether the suggestions consist of highly profitable investment opportunities, advice advocating buying a business, or advice that you begin a new career—these are times when it's important to remember that old saying: think twice, act once. And,

of course, be sure to call on your support network for advice.

Because the loss of a spouse puts you in what may be a vulnerable emotional position, it's important to seek counsel from someone who knows you well and has your best interests at heart before making any decision that you may come to regret. It can seem overwhelming to face the prospect of managing your own finances for possibly the first time in decades while you are still grieving the loss of your life's partner. But with some help from family and friends and a bit of professional guidance, you can succeed in taking responsibility for your financial future.
