Brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Holiday season is upon us once again, yet this year it looks a lot different. In years past I have often complained about all the cheesy Christmas decorations and present ideas that flood the store shelves starting around mid-October yet this year they have given me an odd sense of comfort. Seeing the items flood the shelves at the local supermarket or department store brings me a sense of normalcy in a time where it seems as if everything is anything but normal. Instead of the usual dread that normally accompanies my thoughts as we enter into the holiday season these familiar trappings of holidays past gives me a sense of hope that one day things will actually return to some version of normalcy.

This sense of hope that is beginning to trickle into my body is actually quite appropriate at this time because we have just entered into the season of Advent and the first candle on our advent wreath is centered around hope. While we wait in hopeful expectation of the birth of our savior we also graced with news of possible vaccines that may be available in the near future, thus freeing us from the grip of this terrible disease that has hurt so many of our brothers and sisters. We hold on to the hope that in the meantime our loved ones not yet affected by this disease will stay safe, as we do what we can to make ourselves and our families safe. We have hope that God will continue to guide our hearts and minds as we continue to navigate this confusing and increasingly anxious time that we are all trying to get through, together.

The second candle on our Advent wreath symbolizes peace, It represents the peace that can be found through faith. Peace is a hard thing to come by in 2020, unrest seems to seep into everything around us. Not only are we trying to navigate through a pandemic but we also had to deal with social upheaval surrounding controversies regarding sexuality, race, policing, and a major election that was very conten tious. Yet despite all this we are reminded to seek peace through God, to not feed into the strife that surrounds us. Too often it is easy to attack those with whom we disagree, rather than recognize that we are all children of God, and we are all hurting. When we feed into toxic behavior, then all we do is create more toxicity and nothing is resolved. In all things seek peace and understanding, rather than just a desire to be right.

The third candle represents Joy, the joy that comes with the birth of our savior and the many other blessings that we have each received. As we navigate through this season (and lets face it, an entire year) of waiting we are called to remember the joy that God has put in our lives. Each and every one of us is blessed in so many ways throughout our lives and this is the perfect time to remember to give thanks for all those blessings. To often we get caught up in the negative things going on around us and we forget to remember all the good things we have.

The last candle represents love, the love that God continues to rain down upon us each and every day as we rest in the knowledge that we are forgiven. It is through that love that we are emboldened to spread love to all those we encounter both physically and virtually. This year showing love looks a lot different. Instead of embracing each other and enjoying large family feasts, we are instead asked to show our love through remaining socially distant and wearing masks. In this way we can keep each other safe and honor the hard work that health professionals are doing on our behalf. If you are choosing to gather with others this holiday season please show them love by getting tested and socially isolating until you gather, if this is impossible then remember that there are many other ways to let people know you love them.

Peace and blessings as you continue to navigate this bizarre holiday season and remember that I am just a phone call away if you need me for anything.
