Living History: King Philip's War

Monday, June 5th at 6:30

David Jennings will offer a sophisticated living history presentation on the King Philips

War. Attendees will be invited to take a step back in time to learn about the bloodiest war in America's history that took place in New England in 1675. In addition to discussing the battles that happened right in our backyard, Mr. Jennings will have historical artifacts, replicas and weapons from the time period set up for viewing. Attendees will be able to handle the items, making the program hands-on and interactive. The living history presentation will provide both education and entertainment.

Lakeville author John Morse will be joining us to discuss and sign copies of his recently published novel, *Half Staff 2018*.

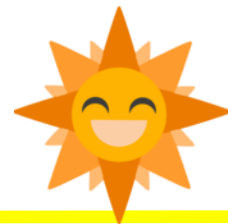


John Morse was commissioned via the NROTC program at Dartmouth College and completed a naval career as a surface warfare officer that included worldwide deployments and command of two surface combatants.

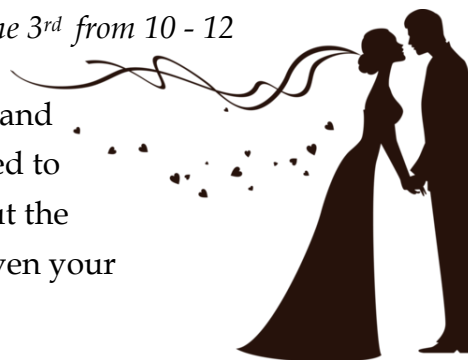
Museum passes are used frequently over the summer months. Don't forget to reserve yours up to 30 days ahead!

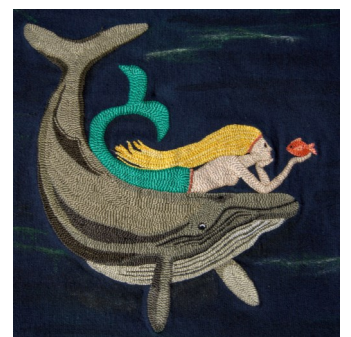
Opening Reception: Saturday, June 3rd from 10 - 12
