Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the regular meeting of Richwood Village Council was called to order by Mayor, Scott Jerew March 13, 2023 at 7:00pm

Mayor Scott Jerew called for attendance. Council members present, Reddy Brown, Pat Morse, Jackie Hamilton, Donald Ridgeway, Jackie Hamilton, Von Beal and George Showalter, Village Administrator and Police Chief Monte Asher, Zoning Officer Marion Bump, and Fiscal Officer Sarah Sellers, and Solicitor Julie Spain virtual.

George Showalter moved and Jackie Hamilton seconded a motion to approve the regular meeting minutes from 2/27/22. Motion passed unanimously.

Pat Morse moved and Reddy Brown seconded a motion to approve the warrants dated 03/13/2022. The motion passed unanimously.

Visitors:

• Amanda White, resident from West Bomford directed council with questions regarding street light, flooding, street repair, street levies, water bill rates and property taxes. Council answered her questions to the best of their ability stating that past levies failed for street repair, the village is not qualified for any grants or loans for the water department unless the rates are increased annually, the village is not in control of property taxes and the flooding is a known problem that has been discussed with other officials in the county including the commissioners. Mayor and Administrator informed White, placing a storm drain near her property would only make the issue worse, there is nowhere for the water to go. Asher will check again on the street lighting. It was suggested for White to contact the commissioners and attend a meeting to voice her concerns as well.
