THE ARMOR OF GOD

EPHESIANS 6:10-18
 "... Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes." v. 10, 11

The Shield of Faith (Eph. 6:16)
 Faith is being sure that God will keep His promises. Faith in God protects you when you are tempted to doubt.

Feet Prepared with the Gospel of Peace (Eph. 6:15)
 The Gospel of Peace is being right with God and being contented in troubled times. Jesus said peacemakers were blessed.

The Helmet of Salvation (Eph. 6:17)
 Put on the Helmet of Salvation by believing that Jesus Christ died for your sins and rose again.

God Answers Prayer (Heart's Desire)

Devotional Reading: Psalm 99

Scripture: 1 Samuel 1:1-2:10

EXALT!

Invocation: Speak Lord so that we hear from heaven. Speak through Your word, our teacher, and to each of us. Center our thoughts on You. During this lesson and in the week to follow, let the Holy Ghost energize our spirits for your purpose. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Declaration: 1 Samuel 1:9-20

9 After they had eaten and drunk at Shiloh, Hannah rose and presented herself before the lord. Now Eli the priest was sitting on the seat beside the doorpost of the temple of the Lord. 10 She was deeply distressed and prayed to the Lord, and wept bitterly. 11 She made this vow: "O Lord of hosts, if only you will look on the misery of your servant, and remember me, and not forget your servant, but will give to your servant a male child, then I will set him before you as a nazirite until the day of his death. He shall drink neither wine nor intoxicants, and no razor shall touch his head."

12 As she continued praying before the Lord, Eli observed her mouth. 13 Hannah was praying silently; only her lips moved, but her voice was not heard; therefore Eli thought she was drunk. 14 So Eli said to her, "How long will you make a drunken spectacle of yourself? Put away your wine." 15 But Hannah answered, "No, my lord, I am a woman deeply troubled; I have drunk neither wine nor strong drink, but I have been pouring out my soul before the Lord. 16 Do not regard your servant as a worthless woman, for I have been speaking out of my great anxiety and vexation all this time." 17 Then Eli answered, "Go in peace; the God of Israel grant the petition you have made to him." 18 And she said, "Let your servant find favor in your sight." Then the woman went to her quarters, ate and drank with her husband, and her countenance

was sad no longer.

19 They rose early in the morning and worshiped before the Lord; then they went back to their house at Ramah. Elkanah knew his wife Hannah, and the Lord remembered her. 20 In due time Hannah conceived and bore a son. She named him Samuel, for she said, "I have asked him of the Lord."

EDUCATE

Childlessness was a circumstance that caused deep personal distress to women during biblical times, and Hannah is no exception. She is married to a well-to-do godly man named Elkanah, who is also married to a woman named Penninah. Unfortunately for Hannah, her barrenness is spotlighted and accentuated by Penninah's fertility. Each year, Elkanah takes his wives and children to Shiloh to worship and offer sacrifices at the tabernacle. Not only is Hannah childless during these pilgrimages, she is taunted by Penninah's irritating and intentionally hurtful comments. She embittered, depressed and cannot eat. She is unfulfilled because she is unable to have what she so desperately wants. Elkanah, sensing her

grave despair, lovingly and tenderly says, "Hannah, why do you weep? Why do you not eat? Why is your heart sad? Am I not more to you than ten sons?" (1 Samuel 1:8).

On one occasion in Shiloh, after the sacrificial meal, Hannah decides to take the issue of her infertility to God and departs to pray (v.9). As she enters the temple, she passes by Eli, the priest, who is seated at the doorway. Hannah, in a state of extreme misery and distress, tearfully pleads her case before the Lord (v 10). Her heart's desire is to be blessed to have a male child. She prays that God would be so gracious as to grant her request and she vows to consecrate the child wholly unto the Lord. "I will set him before you as a Nazirite until the day of his death. He shall drink neither wine nor intoxicants, and no razor shall touch his head" (v. 11). In those days, a vow of this nature would have been carried out as long as it was not repudiated by her husband.³ (Verse 23 confirms Elkanah's full support of his wife's promise to the Lord.)

Unbeknownst to Hannah, Eli is watching as she prays. Even though her mouth is moving, he hears nothing. Completely misreading her piety, he openly chastises her for being drunk. "The suspicion of the aged priest seems to indicate that the vice of intemperance was neither uncommon nor confined to one sex in those times of disorder."⁴ On the other hand, perhaps Eli's erroneous accusation stems from his laxity as high priest and civil judge. His greed and the fact that his two sons, who are also priests, take advantage of the people and profane the sanctuary (see 1 Samuel 2:12-17) point to his diminishing competence as a godly leader. Regardless of the reason for his mistaken impression of Hannah, she sets the record straight. She tells him she is not a woman who disrespects the sacredness of God's temple. She has not even had a single drop of wine. Discouragement and disappointment have driven her to the altar, and she is pouring out her heart to God (1 Samuel 1:15-16). Realizing he is mistaken, Eli says to Hannah, "Go in peace; the God of Israel grant the petition you have made to him" (v. 17). Hannah receives the words of the priest as prophetic and leaves the temple filled with joy and returned to her husband.

God answers Hannah's prayer. She conceives and bears a son, whom she names Samuel (Hebrews, God has heard). Hannah fulfills her promise that he will be raised as a lifelong Nazirite (v. 21-28). Samuel

eventfully becomes a godly prophet and the last judge of Israel.

ELEVATE

The Bible tells of several instances when God intervened in the lives of infertile women, blessing them to become the mothers of great heroes of the faith. Some of them include Sarah (Isaac), Manoah's wife (Samson), Rachel (Joseph), Elizabeth (John the Baptist), and in our lesson today, Hannah (Samuel). Some of these women were beyond childbearing years when God answered their prayers to conceive. Nevertheless, all of them felt blessed to bring a child into the world. There is one person, Michal, a daughter of King Saul, whose story of infertility is mentioned in the Bible, but does not include a miracle baby by divine intervention.

Sadly, infertility is still an issue to this day. Infertility can have a devastating impact on one's emotional well-being, causing feelings of anger, depression, social isolation and inadequacy. Modern medical interventions, such as in vitro fertilization, are extremely expensive and success is not guaranteed. The struggle of infertility too often results in weakening and irreparably damaging marriages.

If we know of persons in our church or class who are dealing with infertility challenges, we lift them in prayer as they deal with this challenge. We can also discuss ways that believers can be a loving, compassionate and empathetic presence to those who are having difficulty or are unable to conceive. Prayerfully, we can find ways to encourage those facing such issues so that they will not feel abandoned by God in this situation.

I THINK:



Let my life be filled with your hope, joy, peace, and faith so that I will always continue to abound in hope through the power of your Holy Spirit. ³


Thank you for equipping me with your protective armor, Father. ⁴ I put on the hope of salvation as my helmet. ⁵ thank you for giving

SALT OF THE EARTH

Read: Matthew 5:13-16
You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, ...it is then good for nothing. Matthew 5:13

What did Jesus mean when He told His followers that they were "the salt of the earth"? (Mt. 5:13). In the ancient world, salt had many uses. For one, it preserved food. Without salts, meat and fish would quickly spoil. In a similar way, Christians who uphold God's moral standards can slow the decay of society.

Salt was also used as fertilizer. Until the mid 1900's, English farmers added salt to their fields to increase the yield. Salt helped crops to grow. Christians too can encourage the growth of what is good wherever they live.

somewhere that you are not aware of. Not so. The entire community gets set to attend various churches all over the country. In the villages, where the mode of transportation to the churches is mainly by foot, you still get the same weird feeling. Lines and lines of beautifully dressed families could be headed in all directions all going to some church for Sunday service.

This goes on every Sunday, rain or shine. It has been this way, back in my days and obviously, even before my days. The only difference now is that the population has doubled, the churches have multiplied and the outfits have become more elaborate, better designed, better embroidered and fancier. The women with their handbags and the men holding on to their bibles.

The question I always asked myself was - why so much effort? The answer will and may be illusive to the uninitiated - that is, if you were not familiar with the African culture. Each and every Sunday is dedicated to thanksgiving for the blessings of the past week and for the hope and prospects of the coming week. How else could Africans survive the unspeakable, unimaginable, harsh, abrasive every day life they have to go through?

Within the walls of the church, don't expect solemn, meditative, and pensive or in any way calm assembly of folks waiting for the 'word'. Far from it. They say: 'God forbid'. The drums take over. The guitars, the keyboards, the cymbals, the horns. If it was prescribed in Psalm 150 it is present in some African church. Plus more. The dance is not bashful, gentle swaying of the shoulders, nor is it just comfortable hand applause and clapping to the beat of the music. Just consider this. Each church has provision for space in the front of the pulpit for full-scale mass dancing and praising. Africans "Let every thing that hath breath, praise the Lord. Praise ye the Lord.' They do!

Praise the Lord they do, and then some. They come on Sundays to express their profound gratitude and thanks for yet another week. Somewhere in the order of service, you will find a line of the congregation as they get ready to testify in their testimonies of thanksgiving for what the Lord had done and hopefully will continue to do for them.

Each testimonial is for 'thanksgiving'. For example, "... the past week, I made a pact with Jesus (pronounced Yesu). I asked Him to help me conquer the devil at my work. By this past Wednesday, the person who had been my major competition in the market moved out of town. For being there when I needed Him I come with this gift for the Lord. Now, if Yesu continues to bless me, the way He has always been, I also promise that I will continue to serve and to bring Him gifts from my heart as He blesses me. Amen...."

The next and the next and the next. Each person gives thanks and makes good on the 'pact', which he or she might have made with the Lord.

The rationale is in the sustained hope and dependence on the miracles that only the Lord can promise. Africa has the best of everything. It has the richest natural and human resources that human beings can ask for. Yet, over the centuries the wealth of the continent has been utilized mainly to the benefit of foreign interests at the expense of the native Africans. In addition, the singular success of alien, colonial and foreign redefinition of ethnic boundaries and settlements have sown seeds of tension, malcontent and hatred causing Africans to spend valuable time and resources fighting each other for positioning and territory instead of progress and advancement. The results have been a life of perennial harsh conditions and endemic, persistent struggle for mere survival.

After church service, that can stretch into the late afternoons, the families, rejuvenated to face the coming week, return home for the best meal of the week. No turkeys, no fillings, but the best they can afford for the week. Next Sunday will be another day for Thanksgiving and testimony.

The presence of the Lord and the promises of hope and salvation that come only from knowing Him have been the source of the weekly thanksgiving that take place in Africa every Sunday. Kwame Ocansey

Words To Live By

The Power of Encouragement

Peter Chin

The whole assembly became silent as they listened to Barnabas and Paul telling about the signs and wonders God had done. Acts 15:12

Read: Acts 15:12–21 (NIV)

Insight

A little detail mentioned in Acts 15:12—“the whole assembly became silent”—is significant. A “sharp dispute and debate” had arisen (v. 2), with Paul and Barnabas on one side and certain believers on the other. These believers insisted that non-Jewish Christians had to adhere to Jewish law and be circumcised. The text tells us, “After much discussion, Peter got up and addressed them” (v. 7). We can imagine how heated that discussion must have been, but Peter outlined a rational defense of the gentiles’ faith (v. 7). He noted how they too had the Holy Spirit, just as the Jewish believers did (v. 8). Peter added, “We believe it is through the grace of our Lord Jesus that we [Jewish believers] are saved, just as they [gentile believers] are” (v. 11). Peter’s calm response to the dispute, along with the testimony of Paul and Barnabas, preserved and enhanced unity in the church.

When he was a young boy, Benjamin West attempted to draw a picture of his sister, but he succeeded only in making a mess. His mother saw his creation, kissed him on the head, and remarked, “Why, it’s Sally!” He would later say that it was that kiss that made him an artist—and the great American painter he would become. Encouragement is a powerful thing!

Like a child learning to paint, Paul didn’t have much credibility early on in his ministry, but Barnabas affirmed his calling. It was through Barnabas’s encouragement that the church accepted Saul as a fellow believer (Acts 9:27). Barnabas would also encourage the fledgling church of Antioch, helping it to become one of the most influential in the book of Acts (11:22–23). And it was through Barnabas’s encouragement, as well as Paul’s, that the Jerusalem church embraced the gentile believers as Christians (15:19). So, in many ways, the story of the early church is really a story of encouragement.

The same should apply to our own lives. We might think encouragement is merely saying something nice to someone. But if we think that way, we fail to recognize the lasting power it possesses. It’s one of the means by which God shapes our individual lives as well as the life of the church.

Let’s thank God for the moments we receive encouragement and strive to pass it along to others.

How has encouragement shaped your life story in some way? Who encouraged you, and how did they do it? How will you encourage someone in your life this week?

AFTER MONTHS OF EAGER ANTICIPATION, THE DAY FINALLY ARRIVES. YOU PACK YOUR BAGS AND OFF YOU GO. SERVAL HOURS LATER THE PLANE LANDS. THE FLIGHT ATTENDANT COMES IN AND SAYS, "WELCOME TO HOLLAND.

"HOLLAND!!!" YOU SAY, "WHAT DO YOU MEAN HOLLAND! I SIGNED UP FOR ITALY. I'M SUPPORT TO BE IN ITALY! ALL MY LIFE I'VE DREAMED OF GOING TO ITALY."

The Holy Spirit Is Our Drill Instructor

“knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience.” James 1:3 NKJV

Mature faith doesn't happen overnight. If we want to have a deep, healthy, solid faith in God, we must exercise our faith to make it stronger.

Think of soldiers in the military. They're not ready for the most intense battles right away when they enlist in a branch of the service. They have to go through basic training. They are drilled

A Bird's Eye View Of The Bible

Old Testament

There are 39 books in the Old Testament library.
There are four types of writing in the Old Testament:
Law, History, Poetry, Prophecy.

It is helpful to know which kind of literature you are reading before you start: is it poetry, or is it history?

LAW

Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy.

The first five books of the Bible are sometimes called the Law of Moses. They give many of God's laws about how to live.

HISTORY

Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1&2 Samuel, 1&2 Kings, 1&2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther.

These 12 historical books cover the occupation of the Promised Land, the time of the Judges, Israel's kings, the fall of the two kingdoms and a return to Jerusalem.

POETRY

Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs.

Nearly one third of the Old Testament is written in poetry. These five poetical books ask profound questions about evil, pain, love, wisdom and God.

PROPHECY

Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi.

The 17 prophetic books account for almost a quarter of the Bible. They are divided into "Major Prophets" (the first five books) and, "Minor Prophets" (the last 12). The "Minor" ones are shorter, not less important.

New Testament

There are 27 books in the New Testament library.
There are three types of writing in the New Testament:
History, Letters, Prophecy.

Before you study a New Testament book it helps to consider what kind of literature you are reading: is it a letter or is it history?

HISTORY

Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts

The first four books, called gospels, are not like our modern biographies. But they do give four portraits of Jesus. Acts is part two of Luke, about the early church.

LETTERS

PAUL'S LETTERS

Romans, 1 Corinthians, 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 Thessalonians, 2 Thessalonians, 1 Timothy, 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon.

We have 13 of Paul's letters. Except for one personal one, Philemon, they were all written to groups of Christians.

OTHER LETTERS

Hebrews, James, 1 Peter, 2 Peter, 1 John, 2 John, 3 John, Jude.

We don't know who wrote Hebrews. Tradition states that all the writers of the New Testament, except for John, were martyred.

PROPHECY

Revelation

Written by the apostle John, this book has seven letters to churches and numerous visions about God.
