Here's what provoked me:

I wrote a letter to the Fort Myers News-Press about the blame and shame on all sides in many of the issues of the day. Hypocrisy is rampant. The title of my letter was changed, which is fine. The title was changed in a manner which no longer reflected my message, which is not fine. Here is my response which was submitted – also as a letter to the editor. You decide if you agree with my concern.

Here's my response:

Don't Change My Message!

I thank the News-Press for publishing my editorial letter, "Trump's poor choice," on 9/2.
