
Death.

A CHALLENGE TO CHURCHES

KANSAS CITY—The remark quoted in many pulpits, that there are no atheists in foxholes, sounds good but doesn't jibe with the facts as they have been noted in Pacific battle areas by Lieut. W. Charles Goe, Navy Chaplain, who suffered wounds while serving with the Marines on Tinian Island.

Now assigned to temporary duty with the Kansas City Office of Naval Officer Procurement, Lieutenant Goe is engaged in a search for chaplains to help meet the Navy's minimum immediate need of 700 in addition to those now on duty. "Those chaplains are needed," Lt. Goe said today, because few of the men now fighting the Japenese have the kind of spiritual understanding that sustains them in their time of greatest trial. The blame for that," according to Lieutenant Goe, "can be checked right back to the failure of many churches here at home to build a true faith in the hearts and souls of our young men.

"In the battle zone," Lieutenant Goe recalled, "we managed to have daily services where the men were able to discuss freely their religious and moral attitudes. One marine said, 'I've been in churches all my life but I've never had a chance to discuss these questions. I was always preached at.' A married man said, 'This matter of living for Christ is a man's job and we've got to go back and take the initiative in making our homes Christian.' Another man came in and asked to talk about the Christian faith. After our discussion he said, 'Do you mean to tell me that you have to have a faith to be a Christian? I've been to church many times and I thought all I had to do was attend and be good.' These are not isolated examples but typical expressions by men whose religion before was merely superficial.

"Men want a job to do. they want a challenge and they want a faith. Our men die for their country because they believe in the cause for which they fight. The Japs come charging in crying, 'Banzai, banzai!' (blood for the Emperor) not because they are comforted by him but because they believe in the God-Emperor combination. We have been pantywaist with our Christianity long enough by just pointing out how glorious it is to believe in and be comforted by God. We've lounged in the luxury of our faith. We've broken off one arm from the Cross and made a wobbly chair our symbol of Christ. It's not enough to sit in the scorner's seat and hurl the cynics ban, but it's time to realize that 'By the grace of God I am what I am' and other men might be the same if they knew

Him as we do." Contributed by Horace Watkins.

The Scriptures sets before all a straight edge to measure our experience and religious activities. Many religious problems perhaps could best be solved by first looking into the Book of Books. RULES FOR PROPER LIVING

Twelve rules were laid down for the guidance of the lay-preachers under John Wesley's leadership. In these modern days of lightness and frivolity, many preachers of today, as well as all Christians, might well think soberly upon the following partial list as given by John Wesley as rules of conduct.

- 1. Be diligent; never be unemployed a moment; never be triflingly employed (never while away time); spend no more time at any place than is strictly necessary.
- 2. Be serious; let your motto be: "Holiness Unto the Lord." Avoid all lightness as you would hell-fire, and laughing as you would cursing and swearing.
- 3. Believe evil of no one. If you see it done, well; else take heed how you credit it.
- 4. Speak evil of no one. Keep your thoughts within your own heart.
- 5. Tell everyone what you think is wrong with him.
- 6. Do nothing as a gentleman; you have no more to do with this character than with that of a dancing master. You are the servant of all therefore.
- 7. Be ashamed of nothing, but sin: not of fetching wood, or drawing water if time permits; not of cleaning your own shoes or your neighbors.
- 8. Take no money of anyone. If they give you food when you are hungry or clothes when you need them, it is good. But no silver or gold. Let there be no pretense to say: We grow rich by the Gospel.
- 9. Be punctual; do everything exactly at the time.
- 10. Act in all things not according to your will, but as a son of the Gospel.
