

## 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) Sunday 27 October 2024

"Master, Help us to See".

Many would be familiar with the saying, "There are none so blind as those who will not see". The Gospel today turns this saying on its head and suggests that there are none so insightful as those who have been deprived of sight. In recent Sundays we have seen original followers of Jesus and other well-intentioned people failing to understand the true nature of discipleship.

A rich young man had turned away from following Jesus because he was a man of great wealth. Following that James and John made a claim for positions of superiority up the discipleship scale as a reward for their ongoing faithfulness.

Prior to these incidents, Jesus had preached the need for people to change their attitudes if they were to embrace the rule of God – you must become like little children: who live by trust, and who listen with open hearts.

Today we are given an example of true discipleship in Bartimaeus, a blind beggar and social outcast who cries out to Jesus. He, although bereft of sight is blessed with insight into the true nature and mission of Jesus, while the sighted people around them, fail to see who Jesus really is.

Bartimaeus in faith, sees with the heart. He recognises in Him the compassion and love of God and he shouts out to Him for mercy. Jesus stops and calls to him. The blind man jumps up to go to Jesus who asks him "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus asks simply for a restoration of his sight. Jesus acknowledges this plea as the sign in Bartimaeus of true faith and he is healed. His sight restored, Bartimaeus follows Jesus along the road to Jerusalem.

The story of Jesus' encounter with Bartimaeus comes to the heart of the Gospel – and a need for a change of heart in each of us: to be poor in spirit, to trust in the mercy of God by being merciful to others: to live in the peace of God by being peacemakers in our world: to become safe by looking out for the safety of others, to know one's weaknesses and to learn from the humble and innocent.

Today we could ask ourselves individually and collectively and as a Church community, where have we been blind and not seen what we should have seen. Acknowledging how selective deafness and blindness of leaders and others failed to protect the innocent and vulnerable of our communities? How do we continue to bring about change? Children's, young and vulnerable people's Safety is everyone's responsibility.

This week is National Children's week. We are reminded in the wake of the tragic Institutional failures of the past to protect children, of the importance of listening to children, young and vulnerable people, respecting their opinions and sharing their concerns. It's about "listening from the heart". Children's Week celebrates the right of children to enjoy childhood. It is also a time for children to demonstrate

their talents, skills and abilities and to feel safe and comfortable in sharing them in a supportive, respectful and caring community to which each of us as disciples of Jesus and sons and daughters of One Loving God are committed to build and maintain.
