Langdon Community Association – Annual General Meeting

March 3, 2019

Meeting called to order at 7:02pm.

- Introduction of Board Chrissy Craig addressed the attendees with a welcome and an introduction of the attending members of the board: Chrissy Craig- Chair, Funds Development Lead; Crystal Upstone - Treasurer; Nicole Porquet-Seitz - Secretary; Jason Walker – Director at Large; Jessica Smythe – Vice Chair; Scott Pike – Recreatoin Lead; Heather Hume – Communications; Rod Spence – Fieldhouse Maintenance; Carisa Glesby – Langdon Days Lead

 - b) Approval of Minutes from March 11, 2018 AGM: Heather and Jessica
- 2. Chair Report thank you for all the work each board member does for this community. Highlights from our last year included:
 - Langdon Days 2018 made an unexpected profit of \$19000 thanks to the community supporting the beer gardens Sat night. Our sponsership was down 10%. This year there will be some changes to the parade route and more security.
 - Events were lacking as we had no events coordinatoor
 - New logos and marketing materials thanks to Amanda Patterson at Creative Solutions

- 3. Project report Jessica discussed LCA projects from the past year including:
 - Main focus was on supporting the quad ball diamond project both financially and by completing minimal competing projects
 - Landscaping between garage and rink (\$107000)
 - Water well unexpectedly needed a new pump and electricity (\$9000)
 - Security Cameras for playground and skatepark (\$3500)
 - General maintenance of the fieldhouse and park
- 4. Treasurer's Report Chrissy presented and discessed the 2018-2019 Langdon Community Association summary of finances. We had a net income of \$209,269.87 and total disbursements of \$249,474.46 (see attached). Note that the fundraising amount is 90% from Langdon Day.
 - Nicole reviewed 2019 Budget (In Sharepoint)
- 5. Grants Chrissy presented that we received grants last year from:
 - Langdon Plus for operational costs including: planters, snow removal, playground maintenance, and rink operational costs.
 - Emergency funding from Rockyview County for the unexpected repairs on our the water well at the fieldhouse.
 - Captial matching grant for the landscaping project with our matching funds from casino income.
- 6. Collaboration Chrissy spoke to the LCA collaboration with other service groups such as Langdon Community Collaborative, Community Garden, Langdon Softball Association, Bow North Recreation, Bow Valley Ag Society, Bow North Community Facility Board, and the Langdon O.K. Seniors Club which has provided us with a bigger scope of the community's needs and developing common initiatives towards community improvements and directives. We have also offered to provide support via free use of the facility for fundraisers and volunteers.
