### Provide input into Prince Albert National Park's management.

Parks Canada is currently reviewing the Prince Albert National Park Management Plan. This important document provides a long-term vision for the park by outlining key strategies for maintaining and improving the ecological integrity, facilitating high quality visitor experience and conducting effective public engagement. Every national park in Canada has a management plan and these plans are renewed every ten years.

Park management plans are developed through consultation with Indigenous Peoples, partners, stakeholders and the public. Public consultation helps Parks Canada achieve its mandate and adhere to the Agency's guiding principles. Engaging Canadians to develop management plans builds relationships, improves understanding and respects the traditions of those who have a connection to Parks Canada places. Management plans developed through public consultation achieve better results thanks to the ideas, support and understanding of Canadians.

The draft *Prince Albert National Park Management Plan* is now available for public review.
