## Happy Groundhog Day!

Just an addition to yesterday's tip.....recall the clip of the shooter jumping to shoot then realizing his shot would be blocked and attempting a dribble? Check it out <u>here</u>. Remember that a travel occurs in this situation *as soon as the dribble is attempted (the ball leaves the ball handlers hand) after the pivot foot has left the floor.* This means that the opponent or anybody else touching it 'first' has nothing to do with the play....a travel violation has occurred as soon as a dribble is attempted.

On to today's tip.....this clip is focusing on the dunk that is attempted but that never clears the net and actually goes back up through the ring and out. This does not occur very often, but is a play that obviously COULD! The ball MUST clear the ring and net by completely going through both. In the case in this clip, the opponent who rebounded the miss was not caught off guard and just started to dribble up the floor. Just be aware of such an unusual situation.
