## From the Pastor's Desk:

August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, falls on a Wednesday this year. The Mass schedule for this holy day of obligation is as follows.

August 5, 2018

Tuesday evening, August 14, a Vigil Mass at 7:00pm in Brandon

Wednesday morning, August 15, Mass at 9:00am in Brandon

Wednesday evening, August 15, Mass at 6:30pm in Pittsford

The above schedule follows what had previously occurred on holy days of obligation. In early September, I will create an ad hoc committee with an equal number of people from both parishes to determine the holiday and holy day Mass schedule for the future. This committee will look to create a schedule for Christmas, Ash Wednesday, Triduum and the holy days of obligation. The crafting of this schedule, where two parishes share one priest, will involve both change and compromise. Once the schedule is established it will be followed year after year so that family celebrations are not in flux. My hope is that the ad hoc committee will complete their task by late October. The new set schedule would be published in early November so that family celebrations could be planned well in advance. I hope that this approach to establishing a set schedule for the holy days is acceptable.

<u>I Will Find You</u> Moses told them, "This is the bread that the Lord has given you to eat." (Exodus 16:15) The wise remind us: money and wealth do not bring happiness.
