



Homily for Easter Sunday

Pastor's Homily: Easter Sunday

"We have never seen anything like this before!" That true statement describes the puzzlement and bewilderment on the faces of many as we get deeper into life turned upside down by the Coronavirus.

The same can be said of that first Easter morning. Mary Magdalene has this puzzled and bewildered expression as she approaches the empty tomb. No one ever prepared her for the shock of her life. The empty tomb leads her to ask many questions about its meaning. We too do not understand how the Virus slipped up on us and caught us unaware.

The obvious questions rolling around in Mary's mind, "Where is my Lord?" "Who took his body?" "What does the empty tomb really mean?" All the data she needs to make sense of this incredulous miracle is very lacking.

Mary is the first witness to behold this earthshaking news. She is left to figure it out on her own. When she realizes the impossibility of it all, she then runs full speed to Peter and John. Perhaps she can, to use a new buzz word *Zoom*, Zoom in finding answers from those who knew Jesus best.

We also have more questions than answers about this very puzzling Virus that has a mind all its own. Questions arise that we never dreamed of asking. Is this the "new normal"? Can we ever get through this and return to life as it used to be? Could God be trying to tell us something?

Figuring out the meaning of the Resurrection is beyond the limited ability of Peter and John. The evangelist explained this at the end of his narrative, "They did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead."

John's insight is most telling. Even though Jesus repeated over and over, just like "Wash your hands 20 seconds", that he would rise on the third day, they simply failed to grasp the message. On one level, we can know Jesus through Doctrines and Dogmas, but not have encountered the risen Jesus in a profound "game changer" kind of way.

The Resurrection acts as a "game changer". Nothing will ever be the same after the Resurrection. Now the reality of his death paves the way for new life. His death on Good Friday is actually the "vaccine" that heals the wounds and brokenness inflicted by the viruses of sin and death.

His empty tomb speaks to us an important message. The tomb is where nothingness and emptiness reign. A life without Christ is empty and lonely. We implore the risen Lord to roll away the stones of doubt and unbelief and know He is fully alive. Jesus' Resurrection did not just "flatten the curve" created by sin and death. He totally leveled it forever!

Globally the Coronavirus is a game changer we did not plan on. Still we believe that the Resurrection brings us hope that new life awaits. By faith we know those who have suffered and died are comforted by the dawning of eternal hope that shined on Easter morning.

Because of our firm hope that Jesus unlocked the door to eternal life, we do not have to remain "locked down" because of fear. Sadness gives way to joy. Mourning is turned into laughter. Darkness is transformed into light. All this is possible because Jesus did the impossible.

Although we cannot physically gather to celebrate Easter Sunday, we can still "Zoom" in and draw close to the Risen Lord spiritually. Joy can still be found if we look for it. Like Peter and John we may not see him, but we still believe he is near. Alleluia !!

The faithful <u>not</u> suffering from the coronavirus can also receive the Indulgence by following the conditions mentioned above and <u>do at least one</u> of the following: Visit the Blessed Sacrament, read Holy Scripture for at least half an hour, Rosary, Way of the Cross, Chaplet of Divine Mercy.
