-Ward Sevila displayed the trophy that was awarded to our region for the 2014 Regional tour. It was awarded in Philadelphia at the National Region meet. Wayne Burgess stated that this is the 1st National award that our region has ever won

Cindy of the Montross Inn is in the hospital after having had a brain aneurysm. She is in a medically induced coma. Keep her in your prayers. Earl Beauchamp has bladder cancer and has had surgery and has come through the procedure with flying colors. Now it will just be routine check-ups.
- -Caitlin Thomas' newsletter has gotten another compliment from another club. We will have to get her registered in the national competition.
- -Birthdays were recognized for those in attendance Dave & Cindy Franklin, Brent Gatton, and Terry Minter.
- -Minutes were approved with the note from Dwayne Schnakenberg that the minutes erroneously had his name as possibly attending the ODMA meeting.
- -Treasurer's report was read and approved.
- -Bob Sydnor presented a board approved card and check for \$300 for partial reimbursement to Ward for his expenses to go to the National meeting. This same stipend was approved forward to future presidents of the club. Ward suggested that maybe the leadership seminars could be paid for in the future to new board members. Wayne said that a new person at national, will be organizing seminars, so there is a lot of changes coming. Wayne mentioned a guy in Philly who teaches facebook, etc. Ward said he is not a big fan of it, but maybe we should look into it to attract younger possible new members. If anyone is interested in putting a facebook page together let Ward or Wayne know.

Old Business

- -Dave & Cindy talked about T & J's Dairy Barn event coming up April 18, 10-3, \$5 donation welcomed. A trophy will be awarded. Ward said he will send the flyer to the club and to the Colonial Beach club. Jill of T & J's is trying to advertise the event on the radio. Ward asked Dave to write something for the newspapers and he would submit it. Dave said that he has researched handicapped vans at many different places and Richmond Mobility may have a van that is \$20,000 cheaper making the goal that much easier to reach.
- -Brent Gatton spoke about our club's car show coming up May 30th. He passed out the sign-up sheet for volunteers for help to pull off the car show. He said the raffle sales have stagnated since the Asphalt Angels car show sales. The next raffle sales event will be the Mechanicsville VFW May 2nd

and Bella's car show. But, he still encourages members to take tickets to sell on their own please. Bob said he and Peyton are working on Bella's in getting ready for their show. Brent requested the check to pay Creative Visions for the trophies that have been ordered. A discussion transpired regarding having spare trophies on hand for certain situations that may crop up during the show. It was voted on to have the club pay for 5 spare trophies to have on hand. Brent asked advice on how to classify big rigs (should we get any). And it was decided that the big rig would be a great example of using one of the spare trophies previously mentioned. Ward asked if a different pewter car design could be used for muscle cars this year – e.g., for the Corvettes and Mustangs, Camaros, etc. Sherry said that there are different ones available if they have not been discontinued and she would look into it. Brent made a strong request that ALL workers for the car show, be on the grounds by 6:30 a.m. Last year a lot of workers didn't show up until 7:30 and we already had a line of cars waiting to register and get parked. Brent asked if the Junior class should be done away with. Ward said that maybe one of the extra trophies could be on hand for this – should we need it. Sherry Gatton mentioned the Nascar simulator deal where if we got 1 or 2 sponsors for the car to be displayed at the sponsor's place of business, then we would get the proceeds for the simulator, the day of our show. Bob mentioned Chandler and Wayne said he would ask them. Ward said that we should talk about the size of the ads in the car show program. Bob suggested giving a book of raffle tickets to sponsors. Brent said that he would be holding a class for judges, a week before the show at his shop in Montross. Sherry asked if we could announce Colonial Beach club's show dates since they return the favor to our club. Ester Minter wondered why waterboy was not listed on the job list so she could sign Terry up for that position. Brent said he would put it on there. -Ward announced that the By-laws were completed by the committee and the board. The final version will be mailed out to the general membership. Ward said, if anyone has any comments about the by-laws, to let Dwayne know. Dwayne wants to see them passed and then we can enjoy the club. Brent had a question regarding the procedures of the committee and board as an observer that the same points were voted on back and forth. He saw things passed and then changed. He wanted to know at what point is something final? Ward said he didn't understand what Brent was talking about. Brent said this has happened before on other issues. Bob said it shouldn't happen in the future and that too many people were in the committee and that the committee should have only been 3 people. King George couple has a life-long love affair with cars

Harry and Mary Jean Inscoe have lived America's love affair with the automobile.

Their story conjures memories of roaring V-8 engines, polished chrome and the tailfins that once graced America's automobiles.

For more than five decades, the King George couple have collected, restored and even raced Chevy automobiles.

Harry Inscoe developed a fascination for cars early in life.

"I've just loved old cars since I was a kid," he said. "I was working on 'em at 15."

At age 16, he bought his first car, a 1938 Chevrolet. Three years and two tradeups later, he purchased a new ride - a 1956 Chevy.

He also developed an enthusiasm for drag racing, which took him to tracks in Colonial Beach, Manassas, Summer Duck, Md. and beyond.

For Inscoe, nothing quite equals the feeling of jamming the pedal to the metal at a drag strip. "I loved speed, and still love it," he said with a grin.

As he immersed himself in the racing culture, Inscoe found a new passion while hitchhiking home from a shift at the old FMC plant. Mary Jean spotted the hitchhiker on Route 3 and, on impulse, gave him a lift. While many might hesitate to pick up a stranger, Mary Jean never worried about her safety.

"I was well chaperoned. I had my mother, father and brother with me," she recalled.

The drive back to King George was uneventful but began the ride of a lifetime for the two young people. "I put him out at his house and thought that was it," Mary Jean said. "I had no idea that I'd be with him for 55 years."

The couple wed in May 1960. Two children and a dozen or more cars later, Harry and Mary Jean are

still very much in love and still enthusiastic car buffs.

A large garage behind their home, houses a collection of vehicles in various stages of restoration, including a '55 Chevy, a '57 Chevy and the 1964 Chevy Impala in which they brought their first child home from the hospital.

Though she shares her husband's love of cars, Mary Jean decided after one trip down the drag strip that she wasn't cut out for a racing career

"I did race his car one time at Summer Duck," she recalled with a laugh. "They were having what they called a Powder Puff race. He told me what to do, but he didn't tell me how fast I was going to be going when I shifted into fourth. When I looked down at the speedometer and said I was going 100, I put my foot on the brake. He said, 'Why'd you do that?' I said, 'You didn't tell me how fast I would be going!'

Harry, on the other hand, never lost a taste for speed,


even after a late-1960s wreck had hit the car," he said, at the Colonial Beach track that left him with a broken




