

#### 2018 Beacon of Hope Award Long Island Volunteer Fair Nassau Community College, Garden City, NY November 20, 2018

In commemoration of the 6<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Superstorm Sandy, the Long Island Volunteer Center is recognizing an individual with the "Beacon of Hope" Award for the fourth year. This award acknowledges those who went above and beyond to respond to the needs of Long Island communities in the wake of the devastation from Superstorm Sandy and who embodied the true spirit of community, commitment to service, and active citizenship while selflessly contributing to relief and recovery efforts.

#### Michael Raab

Michael Raab is this year's recipient of the Beacon of Hope Award for his unparalleled humanitarian work on behalf of Superstorm Sandy survivors. Mike's efforts to respond to the needs of Long Island communities in the wake of the devastation from the storm embodied the true spirit of community and advocacy while assisting with relief and recovery efforts. He retired in June from his position as the Superstorm Sandy Recovery Liaison for Nassau County and in his own words, "It is with humility and pride to share with you, that my work at the Nassau County Office of Housing and Community Development has helped scores of families refinance their mortgages, facilitated the safe housing of hundreds of homeless individuals and families, co-founded the Long Island Housing STARTS Coalition to encourage new truly-affordable housing, managed Red Cross disaster shelters, and most recently bridged the gap for thousands of homeowners to recover from Superstorm Sandy and navigate the maze of post-disaster challenges." LIVC Board member Diana O'Neill said, "Michael Raab was truly a change maker and garnered the respect and admiration from government, emergency services, nonprofits, community groups and affected individuals for his relentless pursuit in seeking remedies for those affected by adverse circumstances and advocating for public policy to advance the human condition." #### Ryan Ramsaroop

LIVC certified NCC student, Ryan Ramsaroop, 400 hours of volunteer service within a 12-month timeframe. Ryan qualified for the Gold level in his age group most recently assisting military and veterans at the Center for Military and Veterans Affairs with their benefits, record keeping, organizing files, work study schedule, answering the phones and making referrals to various offices within the college. When honored as a Newman Civic Fellow, Ryan shared, "My parents immigrated to this country with three children. Adjusting to a new environment in the Bronx projects with inadequate resources, from food to finances to social support, was a tough challenge. Witnessing their struggles inspired my passion to engage the related issues of immigration, poverty and hunger. After completing high school, I waited three years to be able to afford the cost of college. My family had little understanding of how to gain access to higher education until a relative informed us about financial aid. I am now majoring in Computer Technology. I spend my non-classroom hours at "The NEST", Nassau Community College's food pantry, and am amazed by the number of students in daily need. As a member of the Campus Ministry, I volunteer in soup kitchens and distribute clothing in my neighborhood. I am always pleased to convey my knowledge on the complex, confusing issue of immigration. It fills my heart with joy knowing that my volunteering makes a difference. Sharing my time and learning to help the less advantaged is a solid Christian moral value. Elizabeth Andrew's quote, "Volunteers do not necessarily have the time, they just have the heart" describes who I aspire to be. "

#### Kyle Hsieh

LIVC certified 163 hours of volunteer service for Chaminade High School Sophomore, Kyle Hsieh, within an 8-month period. Kyle qualified for the Gold level in his age group by volunteering in many different capacities throughout Long Island and New York City. There is a focus on capturing as much genetic variation as possible when collecting and propagating plant material while minimizing the ecological impacts of harvest.
