You won't believe it. I met he who said he was "The Greatest," Muhammad Ali.

When I met Muhammed Ali I was pastor of Jonesboro Baptist in Roseland, VA. Thirty one miles, north of the church, up the mountain, is a golf and ski resort called Wintergreen. It is located about 30 miles from Charlottesville, VA, in a beautiful little town called Nellysford, which had less than a 1,000 residences at the time.

It was on a Sunday afternoon sometime between 1979 – 1983 that Ali visited the Nellysford area to receive a key to the resort, or either the town of Nellysford because he had purchased some property in the area.

Ali was his usual self: loud, proud, funny, and warm to the relative few people who had gathered to see him receive the "Key to the Town."

As they presented the large wooden-shaped key to Ali he stood there looking at the key. He said with a mischievous grin, "I have never seen such a large key for a small place," in all my life.

Ali stood on a wagon and flirted with the girls and joked with the small crowd in attendance.

Across the road from the world heavyweight champion of the world was a little league baseball game being played with no acknowledgement that Ali was even in the area. Ali looked over at the two teams and yelled, "Hey don't ya'll know that I'm over here?" He paused a moment, and then pretending to be angry, made a gesture with those famous fists of his and said, "I'll come over there and whop the whole team." All of us enjoyed a good laugh – along with Ali.

I wanted to get an autograph, but the only thing I had to write on was my Sunday church bulletin I had stuck in my pocket following church that morning. I handed it to Ali and he signed it, but he didn't smile, as he noticed it was a church bulletin. He later made a joke, during his short speech, about being afraid of The Holy Ghost. I hope that church bulletin with Ali's signature is packed away somewhere.

Jesus said in (Matthew.18:4) "Whoever then humbles himself as this child, he is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven."

In (John.14:28) Jesus says, "... for the Father is greater than I."

Think about it, he who said he was the "greatest" is dead, but He who said, "My Father is GREATER than I," is still alive.
