

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

REMAIN A DISCIPLE OF THE LORD

Joshua (a variant of the name Jesus) gives his people three options. The gods "beyond the River" (24:15) are their distant ancestors' gods, from before Abraham and Sarah. Nostalgia would inspire this choice. "The gods of the



Amorites" (24:15) are those of their current non-Jewish neighbors. Choosing this option would ease their acceptance as foreigners. But they all choose to remain loyal to the Lord. After all, their God led them out of

slavery, gave them hope during their hardships in the desert, and guided them to the Promised Land. By our Baptism, God has rescued us from the slavery of sin, given us the hope of eternal life, and guided us along right paths. Alternate paths may be easier or more socially acceptable, but our moral conscience tells us that these are not the values that will lead us to our eternal home.

Today's second reading begins with an unfortunate analogy too reflective of its time, but the second half is the point. Christ is the head of the Church. This is why we often call the Church the body of Christ.. Like a married couple's love, which leads one spouse to sacrifice their own desires for the other, Christ's love for us—the Church—led Him to sacrifice Himself for our salvation. His body is the living bread that gives us life eternal.

A little context might help in today's Gospel, which begins with "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" (John 6:60). What saying? What did we miss? This: Jesus had just told

them that He is the living bread and that in order for them to have life they must eat His flesh and drink His blood. Yes, this is much harder to handle than the multiplication of the loaves and fish, which must have seemed like a lifetime ago. Sadly, but unsurprisingly, many of His dis-



ciples bailed. But no matter how confused or shocked the Twelve may have been, Peter drills down at once to the essential truth: "You have the words of eternal life" (6:68). Each time we respond Amen we affirm our acceptance of Jesus' challenging words.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Submission as Stewardship.

We aren't comfortable with the idea of submission. Our society champions equality, and rightly so — but it's a mistake to think that submission is at odds with equality. To submit ourselves fully, we must first be free. We must first be our own masters. God has granted us that freedom with the salvation He offers. We are no longer the slaves of sin. Now He asks us to be subordinate to one another, in the name of Christ.

What a completely uncomfortable task! What He's asking is for us to be subordinate to the person who irritates us the most. The person we really can't stand. The person who doesn't respect us or appreciate what we have to offer. The person we think we're smarter than, more talented than. The person we envy.

That's the real challenge of stewardship, isn't it? Subordination. Inconveniencing myself by giving of time, of money, of relationship. Putting the needs or wants of another above my own when they haven't done anything special to earn it.

I invite you to consider the cross — the most radical expression of submission, and of stewardship, that ever existed. If there was ever someone who deserved superiority, isn't it the God who let Himself be nailed to a tree, who gave so freely of His life, His body, His blood, His everything?

To look at Him in His agony is to truly understand the beauty of submission — of laying down what you have for the good of the other.
