appy March! The New Year is flying by already and spring is almost here. That means many of us will be taking time out to do some spring cleaning: Clearing out closets and attics, holding garage sales, and just getting rid of unwanted nick knacks. Before the leaves start growing again, it is also time to trim those trees and bushes.



If you can't wait bulk trash pickup, or you missed the last one, the City of San Antonio offers Free Landfill Days. The next ones will be on April 14 and July 14. Hours are limited usually from 8 AM to 1 PM.

Items accepted at the city landfills include appliances, bagged litter,

brush, carpet, fencing materials, furniture, mattresses, tires (limit 6 passenger tires per household), toilets, and water heaters.

To qualify to take your trash to the landfill at no cost, you must (1) be a City of San Antonio solid waste fee rate payer, (2) bring a valid picture ID, (3) bring a copy of your most recent CPS Energy Statement showing payment of City Services for Solid Waste Fee, and (4) cover your loads with a tarp.

No roofing materials, sheet rock, dirt, brick, lumber or construction materials will be accepted. The city also will not accept industrial, commercial or construction waste.

Some of the nearest landfills are the TDS Transfer Station (for bulky items only) at 11601 Starcrest and the Bitters Brush Recycling and Bulky Waste Collection Center (for brush and bulky items

only) at 1800 Wurzbach Parkway.

All items listed above can be dropped off at the following centers: Republic Landfill Services, 7000 Interstate 10 East and Waste Management Landfill, 8611 Covel Road.

ROYAL RIDGE CITIZENS ON PATROL

n 1992, then Southwestern Bell Mobile Systems introduced the Cellular On Patrol (COP) program as an informal service for cellular phone subscribers providing free air time for 911 calls and non-emergency calls to the San Antonio Police Department (SAPD) dispatch and to the Department of Public safety outside of the city. Subscribers were encouraged to use the free-dial numbers to seek assistance and to report accidents or crimes they observed while mobile.

The following year Bell partnered with the city and the San Antonio Police Department to sponsor a more structured COP program where neighbors

would be trained by the SAPD and patrol their neighborhoods using SBMS cell phones preprogrammed with free dial emergency numbers. The first COP class graduated from the Eastside substation in October 1993 and the program was then expanded to include the entire city beginning with classes at the Northside substation in May of 1994.



Royal Ridge neighbors were first trained in July 1994 and by the end of the year thirty eight folks had been trained. Several of those folks are still patrolling with Royal Ridge (RR) Citizens On Patrol as the COP program is now named. RR COP

membership increased and remained stable in the mid-to high 40s for the remainder of the 1990s and early 2000s where it began to drop off for a number of reasons, e.g. moves, other priorities, aging, deaths, etc. Active RR COP membership is now at its lowest level since the beginning of the program with just 22 members, roughly half of what we had for many years and what we need to sustain the program. Here is a breakdown of current participation by RR neighborhood.

So, where is this going? If RR COP is not sufficiently meaningful or attractive to our younger and newest neighbors and our membership doesn't grow in the near future, RR COP membership will continue to decline and the program will be discontinued. The end is near without new interest and greater participation.

Let me hear your ideas on how to keep this long standing collective safety and security program viable. Silence and lack of participation will be the death knell for this program in the not too distant future if we fail to generate greater interest and participation.

Thanks to all our past and present RR COP members for your commitment, contributions, and continued support.


