A Holiday Message Rabbi Joseph Lichtman z"l

(The last message he wrote for our bulletin from the 2005 BY Bulletin)

uring the 10 Days of Penitence, we Jews come to our synagogues in order to set for ourselves goals for the coming year. We make an extensive search to see where we have fallen short during the past year, and how we can live up to the promises we made, in order to improve the quality of our spiritual lives. Our goals are to strive for a higher perfection, to attain a greater moral level and to achieve a more noble sense of being a Jew. And so if we appear before G-d with less than our best, then what will be granted will be a watered down version of our requests?

When Moshe prays for his people that G-d should show His mercy towards them, G-d answers solachti kidvorecha - "I will grant your wish according to your own words." If your words ask little, and if you are happy with being morally bankrupt, then this is what will be granted to you. However, if your words speak volumes about reconciling with G-d and readjusting your life to reflect sincere t'shuva, then this is what you will get. A chasid was once asked when he expected *Mashiach* to come. When he answered that he did not expect Mashiach to come at all, everyone was surprised. Whereupon he explained: "In each of us," he explained, "there is a spark of the *Mashiach*. We combine our individual sparks, creating, thereby, a great light that will illumine the entire world with the Messianic Peace and Tranquility for all Mankind." As Jews, we have to hold on to our sparks of the Mashiach. We must have these sparks penetrate our daily lives, in our homes, at our jobs and into everyday occurrences. This will raise our moral level and put us into a proper t'shuva mood.

We find written in the *Chumash* that when Avraham was about to sacrifice his son Yitzchak, an angel called out, "*Avraham*, *Avraham*, do not touch the boy for I know that you are a good, loyal, G-d fearing person." The Talmud comments that whenever the name of a person is called out twice by G-d, it is *lashon chiba hu* - it is a sign of G-d's love. Only two other times do we find G-d calling a person's name twice.

When Yaakov learns that Yosef is alive and G-d appears to ask him to come down to Egypt and says "Yaakov, Yaakov, do not be afraid of going to Egypt, for I will make you into a great nation." Lashon chiba hu.

Forty-Sixth Annual Cathering & Awards Dinner

CONGREGATION BAIS YITZCHOK CHEVRA
THILIM'S ANNUAL GATHERING AND AWARDS
DINNER was held on Sunday, June 11, 2017 at the
YM-YW of Union Country, Green Lane, Union, NJ.
It was a joyous afternoon with almost ninety Bais
Yitzchok members, supporters, family and friends of
our honorees in attendance. This event was
originally set for last fall when we would have
honored our current honoree, HERBERT KAISER.
The unfortunate passing of Herby's mother, Hannah
Kaiser z"l, necessitated a change in plans. The new
date followed Mrs. Kaiser's one-year yahrzeit and the
unveiling of her monument earlier that day.

The evening began with a reception hour expertly catered by **Pinchas Kasirer** of **Glatt Star Caterers.** Afterwards, with everyone assembled in the main hall, the formal program began. Opening

remarks were offered by **Rabbi Moshe Abramowitz**, Shul President, followed by recitation of Thilim with its reference to *Yerushalayim*, the theme of the evening. Awards were presented to our honorees.

Herby Kaiser, *Tzvi Shmuel*, grew up in Elizabeth, with all his personal life-cycle events celebrated at Bais Yitzchok, *bar mitzvah*, *ufrauf*, *sheva berachos*. Around 2001, Herby joined our other *Gabbaim*, as *Gabbai R'vii*. He held this position until a year ago when he relinquished that position to join the Board. During these many years, Herby's continual presence was a given.

In 2005 he moved to the North Avenue section of town when he married Judy. Even in his new location, he was always eager to *lain* and give



Lennie Brandwein a break. He was present on *Simchas Torah*, where he earned the moniker, *Herby – the* "*Make it happen Man.*"

His energy and enthusiasm, leading all the songs during the *Hakafos*, gave us a needed lift for Yom Tov. His communal contributions are many. He has read the *Megillah* for many unable to get to Shul, often at private homes and at nursing homes and once, at Bais Yitzchok, when our regular *Baal K'riah* was away.

For years Herby was in the forefront of replacing *machzorim* for each *Yom Tov* - changing the *Paroches*, Torah covers and table covers for the *Yamim Noraim*. Purim is always better with him there. He has always been a strong support and presence for his parents, and with the loss of his mother, his display of *kibud av* - honor shown to this father, Hermann, may he live and be well, is always evident.

We are honored to pay tribute to his contribution to Bais Yitzchok and the Elizabeth Jewish Community with the **Kesser Shem Tov Award.** Mazal Tov to Herby, his wife, Judy, his father, Hermann and his sister, Hindy. *Kol Hakavod*!

IRA PENNER, arrived from Boston, MA about twenty months ago and graciously offered his skills and assumed the *Gabbai Sheni* position, vacant since Anchel Nulman made Aliyah with his family, last year. His move followed the sale of the company he founded in 2001, Digital Publishing Solutions, to a Jersey City based printing group. While in Boston, Ira was very active in Jewish education and was on the board of the Mesivta of Boston and an adviser and fund raiser to the Haredi elementary school, Torah Academy, the Kollel of Greater Boston and the Boston regional Bais Yaakov.

Although seemingly quiet and unassuming, Ira, has much to contribute. Learning the *minhagim* and practices of a Shul might be daunting, but Ira handled the challenge with confidence. On Shabbos morning he insures that we start as close to 8:30 am as possible with *Pesukei D'zimra*. He is adept at *davening*, reading the *Haftarah* and anything else he is asked to do. We are happy to honor Ira's participation in the leadership of the Shul and present him with the **Yesodei Hatorah Award** at this year's event.

If additional tables are needed, check the Kiddush Policy letter for details. Kiddush for a special event or Simcha (Bar Mitzvah, Ufruf, etc.) is not subsidized by the Shul.
- The cost of Shalosh Seudos is \$25.
- Use the Sign-up sheet downstairs to reserve sponsorship for a Kiddush or Shalosh Seudos. A copy of the complete policy governing Kiddush sponsors and use of the Shul is also posted there.

A Holiday Message continued

Then later, after Moshe escapes from Egypt and is out tending his flock, he sees the beautiful sight of a burning bush that is not consumed. When he comes to the place on the mountain where the bush burned, the voice of G-d calls, "*Moshe, Moshe*, do not come closer. Remove your shoes from your feet." *Lashon chiba hu*. In all instances it was a sign of G-d's love.

We can, however, employ a play on words and say, it is not so much a sign of G-d's love - *chiba* but rather, *chova* - a sign of discipline and responsibility. Since both words are spelled the same, we can say that love without a display of responsibility is an empty and meaningless expression.

Each one of our ancestors, Avraham, Yaakov and Moshe, assumed a degree of responsibility together with G-d's love.

This then becomes the theme of the High Holiday period -- to set goals of perfection, to initiate a sense of *t'shuva*, to expect from G-d that which we requested with honest and true prayers, and finally, to assume a life of discipline and responsibility for all our actions. If these goals are reached, then G-d will grant us a *K'siva va'chasima Tovah*.

A year in which we will be inscribed and sealed for Blessing - Peace and Prosperity. Amen
