Lord Teach Us to Pray

Luke 11:1 "... Lord teach us to pray..." not how to pray, but to pray. If the Lord is to teach us to pray we need to know something about prayer.

Prayer is not a part of the armour, shield or sword, we do not read where prayer is one of the gifts or calling of God: prayer is not persuading God or winning God to our side. Prayer does not influence God's purpose, but it does influence His actions. We need to remember this world is a battlefield, not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against darkness and spiritual wickedness in high places. Prayer gives God a foothold in the enemies territory. Daniel prayed for twenty-one days, God heard him the first day and started with the answer directly, but the enemy hindered.

Delays are not denials — delayed answers to prayer are not only trials of faith, but they give us opportunities of honoring God with our steadfast confidence.

Preserved in Bedford, England is the door of the jail behind which the writer, John Bunyan, was imprisoned: Bunyan must have offered up many prayers, asking God that the door might swing open for him: yet for twelve long years the bolts on that door were not withdrawn, the delays were for good, dreams were going on behind that door which the world needed. When the Pilgrim's Progress of which Bunyan's dreams took place was completed, Bunyan's Lord, who had never forgotten him while the years passed slowly by, swung that jail door open.

Let us wait upon the Lord, for they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength. Waiting requires strength, and is far more difficult than working. It demands the absolute surrender of self to God. Trials, tests and persecutions are but common to man, they put iron in the soul, and "work for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory."

We can expect our prayers to

be answered on the following conditions. "That they are begotten of God."

"Likewise the Spirit helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered, and He that searcheth the heart knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because He maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God." Romans 8:26-27.

It is wonderful to know that the Holy Spirit who indwells us, helps us in our weakness that we might pray as we ought. We have no power unaided to realize our hopes, our aims, but the Holy Spirit by taking hold together with the saints on the throne of God so that the very power of God is realized in our lives. Through united prayer we have power to pull down the stronghold of Satan and reach the throne of God, thus we become co-partners. We may forget to pray, the Holy Spirit never does, He is our intercessor.

"That they are the will of God."
"And this is the confidence that
we have in Him, that, if we ask
according to His will He heareth
us, and if we know that He heareth us, whatsoever we ask, we
know that we have the petition
that we desire of Him." I John
5: 14-15.

Nothing is beyond the reach of prayer, except that which lies outside the will of God. The prayer of intercession is reaching out for others in soul travail: communion and petition stores our lives with the power of God; intercession lets it out on the behalf of others. Our whole life is dependent upon the giving hand of God, yet true prayer never stops at petition for ones self, but reaches out for others. The pathway to a human heart is through a human heart. The "larger prayer" comes only as we in living love reach out in soul travail in behalf of others.

"That they are offered in

faith." Mark 11:22-24.

"Therefore I say unto you, what things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them." Verse 24.

In coming to the Lord in prayer make a definite request, as has been stated many times, 'say what you mean, and mean what you say', remembering, the knob to be turned is on our side of the door: our receiving hinges on the word "believe." Faith releases the power of God, and when the power of "prayer" and the power of "faith" meet there will be a performance. The prayer of faith is the key that opens heavens door and starts God acting on our behalf.

"That they are offered in the Name of Jesus."

"If ye shall ask anything in my name, I will do it." John 14:14.

Oh! The power in the name of Jesus, we have not yet realized the power in His wonderful name. But again there is a condition, and that is obedience to His known will for our lives, obedience brings confidence that He will not withhold any good thing from them that walk uprightly; How willing the Lord is to give good gifts to those who ask, seek, knock, and desire spiritual gifts; Jesus is the channel in which we reach the Father.

Remember our prayers must be, "Begotten of God, The will of God; offered in faith, and in the name of Jesus." Three things result from waiting on God: a refreshing; a fragrance; and the bearing of fruit. The fruit of the Church is souls.


Report was given on the Apostolic Faith report by Brother Dibbens.

Led by the Spirit

One thing that was present among the early church after Jesus Christ left the disciples here on earth, was the direct leadership by the Holy Spirit. This was Christ's will and way for His church to be directed, since He could not be with them Himself. It was needful that He go away so this Comforter and guide could come.

After Saul of Tarsus became Paul the Apostle and disciple of Christ's, he was many times led directly by the Holy Spirit. He spoke with a boldness that could have only been the result of the fullness of the Spirit motivating every action of his life. He was not afraid to answer a sorcerer who was being used by the Devil; he spoke fearlessly to idol worshippers; he told the story of his conversion to rulers and kings. He was led by the Holy Ghost to change his route to Jerusalem. He was chosen and led by the Spirit for missionary work out of Antioch. Clearly his life was one surrendered to the will of Christ!

While we earnestly believe and teach the infilling of the Spirit in a baptismal form for every individual's life, the leadership directly by this Holy Person seem to be missing in many cases. There are people who are earnestly seeking to be led by the Holy Spirit, but generally speaking, God's people seem to be afraid to really trust in this Divine leadership. If not afraid, perhaps Christians in general are too unconcerned, or too preoccupied with their own lives, to do what He asks.

Have you ever considered the fact that one of the purposes of the Holy Spirit is to personally supervise our worship services? If this were the case, perhaps they would not always follow the same pattern. Every service must of course have order, and a certain extent be carried out in the same manner; but every service is important to God and should be given prayerful thought and consideration. There were times

a few years ago when we sometimes dismissed the singing and preaching because everyone had a burden to pray, and the entire service was given to worshipping God in prayer.

Do we as song leaders, special singers, and even ministers actually seek to be led by the Spirit of God in conducting our part of the service? Do we automatically sing three songs every service without giving thought of the leadership of the Spirit even in this part of the service? Have our testimony services become so formal that we quench the Spirit of God rather than speak the things He leads? Have you ever awoke in the night and felt that God was dealing with you but because it was to pray, a strange thing to explain this to your companion, or it became easier to forget about it and go to sleep, you quenched the Spirit of God in this way? The Bible plainly says to "Quench not the Spirit", and there are many more ways of doing this than just failing to speak in other languages and completely yielding to Him in prayer.

Perhaps it has distinctly been laid upon your heart to fast for your church service, or for your minister, or even your own spiritual need, but because you were hungry at meal time, you quickly dismissed the Spirit's leading, and the burden left also.

If God tries to deal with us, and use and direct us by His Spirit, then we fail to respond; it surely must become displeasing to God; and after so long a time, he may not try to deal with us as frequently.

Are we afraid to trust our leadership into the hands of the One who may change our accustomed style of doing things? The Holy Spirit did change Paul's course of action on several occasions. By committing himself to the Holy Spirit, he convincingly testified at every opportunity of Christ.

Let us pray that our lives and services may be conducted by the

Holy Spirit Himself. What a difference it would make! There would be an end of formalism, and yet eliminate fear of fanaticism. If we belong to Christ, and actually trust in the Holy Spirit for guidance, fanaticism would not be the result! A revival of spirituality and holiness would have to follow!

In the book of Revelation, where John speaks of the onehundred and forty-four thousand who will be caught up to the throne of God and thus escape the tribulation period, one of the qualifications of this group is to "follow the Lamb whithersoever He goeth." Throughout the length and breadth of our land today, and even across the seas. God is preparing a people for this great event. Many are seeking the Lord for deeper experiences, and many nominal church members are receiving the Holy Spirit in baptismal form, with the evidence of speaking in another language. May we be among the number who are still willing to be Spirit-filled and Spirit-led! Let us prayerfully ask God for grace to do His bidding whatever the cost! May we not be bound by customs and traditions of men as the Pharisees and Publicans were in the time of Christ, that we fail to recognize the moving of the Spirit among the true Church of God. Then may we have the courage and strength to specifically follow His leading in all we do! Let us not question, but unfalteringly follow in the steps He leads!
