Welcome to the Trustee's Corner! In the coming months this section will give you some insights into the types of things the Puyallup Aerie Trustees are working on.

Many of you may have seen and responded to the survey forms placed in the restaurant and bar. The survey was put together by the Trustees to get an understanding of how the Aerie is feeling on many topics, as well as giving members a chance to make some general comments. The results of the May surveys are posted on the wall as you enter the bar. The general comments are posted there as well.

One of the outcomes of the survey was that there are a number of members who would like the opportunity to volunteer. Volunteer forms will be placed throughout the Aerie; if you wish to volunteer for Aerie activities, fill out the form and place it in the suggestion box. Volunteer forms will be forwarded to Auxiliary and Aerie coordinators.

Another change you will notice in the coming months is the use of pour spouts by the bar staff. The pour spouts will ensure that members always get a consistent and accurate serving of alcohol in their favorite drink. The spouts are calibrated for 1.5 oz., the current free pour amount is intended to be 1.25 oz. The Trustees know this is a change to the normal bar operations, but consistent, calibrated alcohol servings means consistent profits for the Aerie. When we use one bottle of liquor, we will know how much money we have made. In the end, the Aerie is a business that must make a profit to survive. Please respect the bar and wait staff as this change is implemented.

If there any topics you would like to see covered, any complaints or compliments, feel free to place a note in the suggestion box or come visit us. The Trustees meet every Wednesday at 5 p.m. in the Poker Room. Drop on by to say hi or ask a question. Together we can make Daffodil Aerie #2308 a place we can all be proud of.
