I distributed the contents throughout the soldiers in my battery. Your support is appreciated and made a difference, especially for those that don't receive packages as frequently.... We have adopted a school that we are trying to help here. The school has a lot of very poor children who cannot afford to buy paper and pencils for class. The school is about 2000 students, grades 1-12. Grades 1-3 are boys and girls while 4-12 are girls only. For people looking to help, any school supplies donated would be appreciated. We are building them a new well and classrooms. Many students are in tents while the first graders have no tent or building and if it rains, they get wet. Please let me know if you would like more information or pictures of the school. With everything these kids go through it is gratifying to give them something as simple as clean water to drink. Once again, thank you for your support."
