Almsgiving: Whoever passesses the goods of this world, and sees his brother to be in need, and yet closes his heart to him: in what way does the love of God abide in him? (1 John 3:17) Giving alms might be difficult if we're on a tight budget but if we think about it most of us are much better off than much of the world's population. This is a hard fact to consider. Jesus said we must give to the poor. "...Amen I say to you, as long as you did it to one of these least of brethren, you did it to me." And though the Church has much to say about prayer and has clear guidelines on fasting the Church mostly leaves almsgiving up to the individual. For this reason, it's important for us to spend a little more time thinking about the 3rd Pillar of Lent, almsgiving. No one can escape the poverty that surrounds us.

Muslims are required to give alms as a kind of tax. "The Arabic word for this pillar (almsgiving) is "Zakah" better translated as purification and growth. Muslims are encouraged to do charitable acts every day of their lives and as much as possible." (Voices of Faith – Muhammad Malik) All Muslims, poor or rich are obliged to do charitable works and to be aware of the needs of others. There's no stigma to being poor in Islam. The poor are holy and close to God because they're poor. By their very existence, the poor enable others the chance for Zakah, which helps all Muslims move toward purification and growth.

Christians and Muslims are in union in the belief of the importance of almsgiving. We are encouraged to do charitable acts every day and to pay attention to the needs of others.

As Christians, we are to see Jesus in everyone. Many of us donate money or time to programs that help the poor but some of us say we can't give money to help the poor because we have family members that need regular financial help. I was surprised to learn that giving financial help to family members is considering almsgiving. Helping a family member in need is a good thing to do.

"For almsgiving delivers from death and keeps you from going into Darkness. Indeed, almsgiving, for all who practice it, is an excellent offering in the presence of the Most High," (Tobit 4:10-11)

4th Sunday of Lent: Sin and Its Consequences Focus: The Consequences of The Fall: The Bad News

1. Quick Review:

2. This week: The Fall; The Consequences of Sin (aka The Bad News)

- a. The Fall
 - i. Revelation 12:9 → Satan; the Devil; the deceiver of the whole world
 - ii. Genesis 3:1 → the most subtle of all creatures
 - iii. Genesis 2:15-17 → the shamar given to the man by the "LORD God" (YHWH)
 - iv. Genesis 3:1-3 → the first accusation of "God" (Elohim)
 - v. Genesis 3:4-5 → "If God <u>really</u> loved you..."
 - His strategy: God is suspicious. He is not good and he doesn't care about you.
 - a. You don't need him. You can find happiness without him.
 - vi. Genesis 3:6 → The Fall: I don't need God to tell me what is good and what is evil.
- b. Relationships are broken (Gen. 3:6-8)
 - i. Man and God: They hid from him.
 - ii. Man and woman: They experienced shame for the first time.
 - iii. Man and creation: Chaos enters. Fear of creation enters.
 - iv. Man w/ self: We develop diseases of various kinds. ... We die. (Rom. 6:23)
- c. Something far worse: Spiritual Slavery
 - i. Romans 3:9 "All men are under the power of sin."
 - ii. CCC 407: By our first parents' sin, the devil has acquired a certain domination over man..
 - iii. Romans 7:15, 19 "I do not understand my own actions, for I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. ... For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do."
 - iv. All people die. Nobody beats death. We are utterly helpless against it.
 - v. Death is so great, so aggressive, so pervasive, and so militant a power that the only fitting way to speak of Death is similar to the way one speaks of God. Death is the living power and presence in this world which feigns to be God. (William Stringfellow)
 - vi. The controlling metaphor here is slavery and freedom. ...either one lives in service to sin and remains in spiritual bondage, or lives in obedience to God and enjoys liberation from Sin's captivity. It is a stark either/or: no fence-sitting, no third option. (Scott Hahn)
