Management Report - Jim Reuschlein, Clearview Property Management

1A. Six units are listed for sale prices range from \$104,000 to \$124,900.00.

Carrying Charge increase of \$32.00 per month starting in January 2019. If members are currently on an ACH with Management company, we will update this information in our system.

Ever increasing cost of asphalt, concrete and roofing work that needs to be done, the increase is necessary. Vinyl project is still on going. Punch lists are being generated, caulking will take place in the spring. The contractors are currently finishing up vinyl on the last few Buildings. Work to be done by end of January, weather permitting, Downspouts and gutters will be installed for buildings 59-64. 2019 Buildings will be determined during spring walk through of property. 9 more buildings will be done in 2019. Members will be given at least one-month notice prior to vinyl work starting.

Management company is aware of brick wall accident at Building 83. Member has been contacted. Work on wall will be done this spring.

Snow removal reminder to everyone. The longer the snow plows sit there waiting for cars to be moved the more it costs. Please move your cars in a timely manner.

The board is aware of the inconvenience of having the dumpster in the vacant field adjacent to Building 149. Members need to be aware that we have a very large ongoing vinyl project and the dumpster will have to remain in the community until the project is completed. Management has discussed and will continue to work with contractors to minimize the amount of debris that is associated with this project and ask them to tidy up surrounding areas. As we move project to the next area members parking spaces may be relocated to accommodate the dumpster.

New Business Discussion of Membership

John McGraw walked property and inspected bus stop lights. Also building 93 sprinkler line is still dripping. Work order has been put into Trala Maintenance.

Judy indicated that she has had several members report boiler and furnaces have not been inspected for 2018. Each member should have their furnaces/boilers inspected annually, these are cleaned every 3 years. Sump pumps will also be inspected during this appointment. 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February's New Outlook

Our mild winter ended when Mother Nature brought several inches of snow followed by bone-chilling winds on Martin Luther King Jr. Weekend. And although the weather kept most of us in for a few days, it inspired us to gaze out our windows at the beautiful snow.

February greets us with hopes for an early spring on the second day of February when Groundhog Day arrives. This unproven Pennsylvania Dutch superstition holds that if a groundhog emerging from its burrow sees a shadow due to clear weather it will go back into its den and we will have six more weeks of winter. If this rodent, also known as a woodchuck, doesn't see a shadow due to a cloudy day, we will be blessed with an early spring. Bill Murray helped popularize this notion with younger generations in "Groundhog Day," a movie we enjoy watching each year.

Whether cloudy or sunny, winter days provide opportunities for us to look at the natural world around us. The leaf-barren trees open our view to squirrel nests, which can now be easily spotted. These large, well-designed circular-shaped shelters are water, snow and windproof. Made of leaves and twigs, these nests are constructed in forked tree branches to give them added strength and stability. Take a closer look the next time you spot one.

The paper wasp nest hanging in the tree on Heritage Boulevard at the bend near Mirror Pond is another reminder of the insects and animals inhabiting our world. According the MSU Extension these social vespid nests are abandoned in the fall. After the new queens leave, all the workers eventually die due to starvation and cold weather. Old nests are never reused, according the MSU, but a favorable nesting site may be selected year after year. For me, this abandoned home is a reminder of the stinging pests that return with warmer weather.

There's not much we can do about the weather, so take advantage of the sites and sounds of our outdoor world this winter. And remember, spring is just around the corner!

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
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
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
