Has somebody ever-told you that it was much easier to "give than to receive?" That is a good roundtable discussion when you need a subject to reflect upon. Our first thought is a financial consideration. It is easier to support a cause or a person because our involvement level is almost non-existent. Hand some cash or monetary gift over and that's usually the end of it. That's not a negative reaction. All of us need to share our blessings in this way helping the church in her programs, missions, and vision provides us with a good foundation to survive in our world. God encourages us to be a cheerful giver. We need to rise to the occasion.

But, giving and receiving involves much more than a financial commitment. What about "caring" for one another. Caring for one another is a much more personal involvement. We care for one another in the simple act of prayer. We pray to thank God for you; to enrich or assist; to intercede for strength and encouragement for you, all of which presuppose a caring or concern for you. Prayer is an absolute necessity in life. What would we be or do without prayer. Caring for one another is a little more complicated.

Most people are much more open to giving care than receiving it. When a person is giving care, he or she is in a position of strength, stability, and authority. When a person is receiving care, he or she is acknowledging weakness, insecurity, and vulnerability.

As a result, there are countless people today who, though they really could benefit from a Christian friend who would listen and care for them, instead tough it out on their own. They remain the strong silent type, or wear a smile across a face that is holding back a flood of tears. Society encourages this (particularly for men). To ask for help is to admit weakness. To show weakness is to admit inferiority.

Our culture tries so hard to teach us to be independent. I really feel God created us to be interdependent . We need each other. We are stronger when we realize we are not alone, we are meant to love, encourage, build up, pray and care for one another. Jesus promises us this when talking about Himself (Matthew 11:28) "Come to me, all you that are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. " But, He is also talking about us in our relationships to one another. God provides the strength and ability to care for one another. Why would we ever "tough" it out on our own. Reflect upon this in your journey in Lent.




