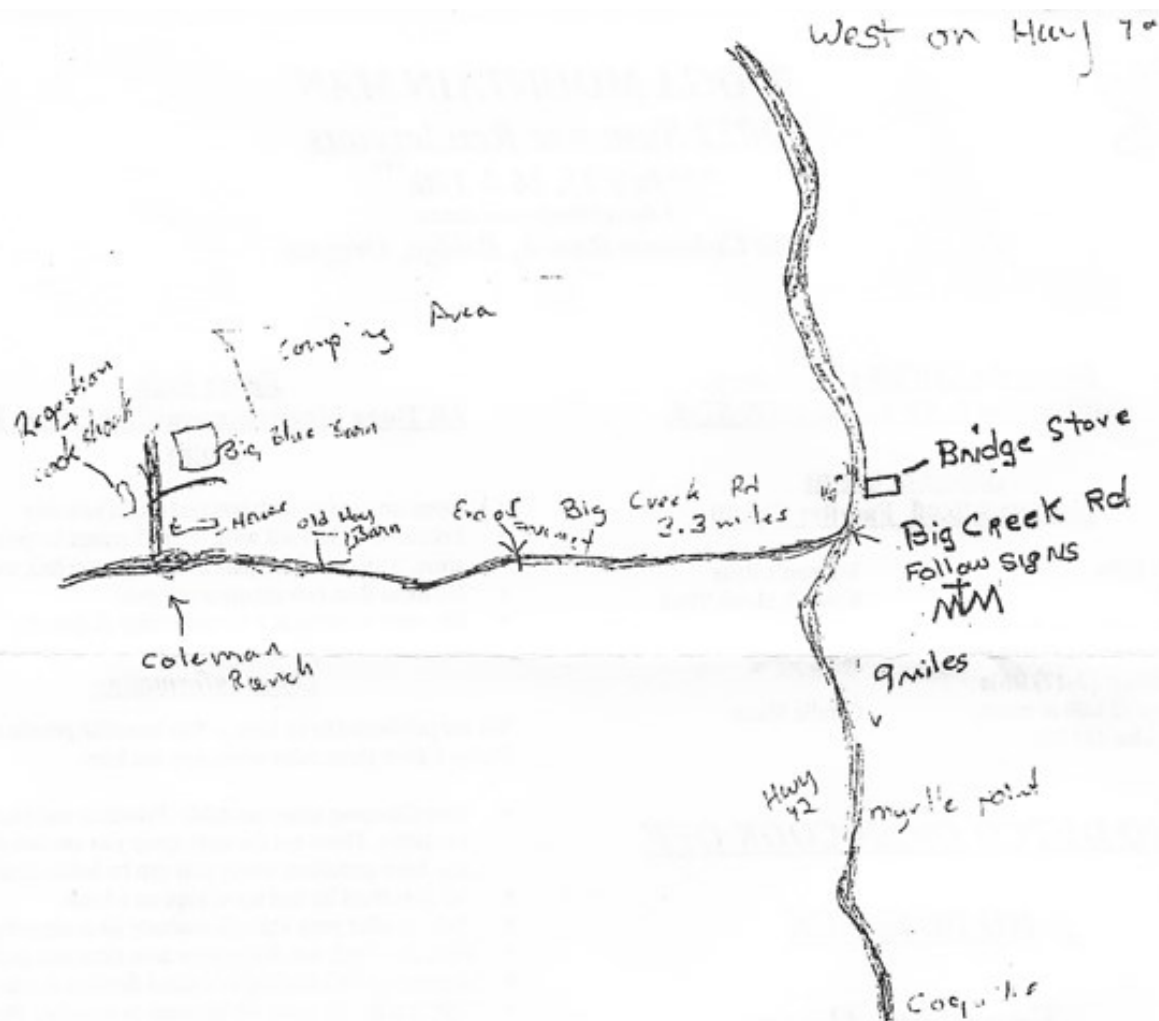

## GRIZZLY GRUB

Linda Fulmer "Muzzle Blasts"

### Rendezvous Cheesy Deer & Potato Hash

- 2 medium potatoes
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- Salt and pepper
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 red bell pepper, chopped
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 8 oz. ground deer meat
- 1/2 teaspoon chili powder
- 1.5 Cups grated sharp cheddar

Peel the potatoes and cut into small cubes (1 1/2 inch). Put in bowl with cold water, mixing to rinse off the starch. Drain and rinse in a colander, then transfer to paper towels and pat dry.

Heat oil in a 10-inch cast-iron skillet over med-high heat. Add potatoes and cook, stirring occasionally, until tender and golden brown on most sides. Season with salt and pepper to taste, then transfer to a plate with a slotted spoon.

Add onion, bell pepper and garlic to skillet and cook, stirring occasionally, until golden brown. Add ground deer, chili powder and 1/2 teaspoon salt and cook, breaking up any meat to combine. Sprinkle the cheese over the hash.

## RUST

Here's a solution for those iron tools or pistol/rifle barrels that got lost overwinter, misplaced during last year's hunt, or under Juniper duff at last years H&K.

At the March meeting, Brent (Cheech) Morgan showed us the results of a solution he has found to de-rust iron.

In an appropriate-sized open container mix a 50/50 solution of **FEED GRADE** Molasses (found at feed stores or farmers) and Water.

Mix it real well and add your rusted iron pieces. Let it soak until it comes clean (± a week). Stir the solution every day and add water to compensate for evaporation. He showed us a pair of shears and a rifle barrel that came out beautiful.

## STAIN

Another solution: for treating fresh yellow saw kerfs in/on old gray barn wood (making picture frames, etc.), or to "erase" fresh limbing cuts on tree trunks, is to pour white vinegar in a glass container and add very fine steel wool pads. Let it brew for ± week and brush the resulting stain on a trial piece of the wood (a wooden-spoon handle or shim also works great).

When you get the shade you want, take out what's left of the steel wool—if you leave the iron in there, the result will be so close to black you can use it for ebony!

New boards can be brushed with this stuff and will antique/driftwood very soon. Can be finished or sealed normally.

**MARCH MEETING:** Lorraine Hayden reported on the Cascade Mountain Men show at Enumclaw, Washington and on the new location for the Forest Hills Black Powder Brigade Spring Rendezvous. She also talked about the Horn Makers Fair she attended in Pennsylvania and passed around several items including a horn snuff box, a horn that belonged to her late husband Jim that was characteristic of a fine horn, and a horn from the 1790s with southeastern U.S. motifs. She also explained horn shaping and decorating techniques. Thank you Lorraine for a very interesting and informative presentation.

#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE FOR APRIL 2022 by Walt Evens:

Greetings! As always, I hope this finds everyone in good health and spirits.

From what I heard, and the photos sent to me, it looks like Mathew did a great job in his first match. I want to thank everyone who helped him out.

Here it's been two months and the mask mandate hasn't come back. Of course, they're optional for anyone in the risk groups.

Two years ago, we were approached by President Tony Hilsendager of the Emerald Valley Chapter of the Oregon Hunters Association (OHA) to come to their meeting and talk about muzzleloader hunting opportunities here in Oregon. This would be followed by a hands-on shooting event the following Saturday while everything was fresh in their minds. Of course, the pandemic hit and everything was postponed. I'll be at their meeting on Wednesday with a slide show presentation. This Saturday the 16<sup>th</sup> is the main event on the Pistol Range at Emerald Empire Gun Club. Set-up is at 9:00 a.m. and the fun starts at 10. I'm not sure what targets to use. We could set up some clangers or either use the gun club red bulls eye or 9" paper plates. The latter two would represent the approximate "vitals" area on a game animal.

So far we have about a dozen volunteers. I spoke with Tony the other day and while he didn't have a total for us, he expected about a dozen people. Due to this being the first time these folks have fired a muzzleloader, EEGC would like to see a ratio of one-to-one. Needless to say, we could use a few more folks. While I have guns for this specific purpose, I've decided to let members bring their own. That way I don't have a bunch to clean when I get home, although it might not be a bad idea for us to show them how to do that, as well!
