

AMELIA VILLAGE, OHIO

Ordinance: O-2019-18

AN ORDINANCE BY THE COUNCIL OF AMELIA VILLAGE, OHIO AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF A NEW VEHICLE FOR USE BY THE AMELIA POLICE DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Police Chief has reported to the Mayor and Village Council that, due to age and condition of a police vehicle currently in use by the Amelia Village Police Department, the Police Department is in need of a new police vehicle to efficiently and effectively preform its assigned duties;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained, by the Council of Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio; that:

SECTION I This Council finds that it will be in the best interest of Amelia Village, Ohio to enter into a purchase agreement to acquire a new vehicle to enable the Police Department to better perform their assigned duties.

SECTION II Council further finds that the required vehicle can be purchased through the State of Ohio without being submitted for public bid.

SECTION III Council authorizes and directs the Mayor and Fiscal Officer of the Village to enter into an Agreement to purchase a 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe Police Interceptor from Tim Lally Chevrolet, LLC, a dealer authorized to sell vehicles under the state procurement process, for the price of thirty five thousand seven hundred fifty nine dollars and eighty two cents (\$35,759.82).

SECTION IV Council authorizes the Mayor and Fiscal Officer of the Village to enter into an agreement with Camp Safety Equipment for the installation of additional safety service vehicle equipment on the vehicle for a cost of nine thousand seven hundred fifty five dollars and ninety three cents (\$9755.93),as shown on the attached quote.

SECTION V Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Revised Code.

SECTION VI That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the Village, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to approve this at the earliest possible time, in order for the Police Department to effectively and efficiently perform the duties and obligations imposed by law. Therefore, provided this emergency clause receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

MR. FISCHER moved to suspend the rules requiring two readings on two separate dates;

MR. FITE seconded the motion.
