3rd Sunday of Advent - Year A 14th - 15th December 2019

First Reading: Isaiah 35:1-6, 10

God himself will come and save us.

Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy. The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God. Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy; for those the Lord has ransomed shall return. They will come to Zion shouting for joy, everlasting joy on their faces; joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended.

The Word of the Lord

Second Reading: James 5:7-10

You also must be patient; do not lose heart, the Lord's coming will be soon.

Be patient, brothers, until the Lord's coming. Think of a farmer: how patiently he waits for the precious fruit of the ground until it has had the autumn rains and the spring rains! You too have to be patient; do not lose heart, because the Lord's coming will be soon. Do not make complaints against one another, brothers, so as not to be brought to judgment yourselves; the Judge is already to be seen waiting at the gates. For your example, brothers, in submitting with patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

Alleluia, alleluia! The spirit of the Lord is upon me; he sent me to bring Good News to the poor. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 11:2-11

Are you the one who is to come, or must we wait for someone else?

John in his prison had heard what Christ was doing and he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?' Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.' As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you. I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.

We all have the ability, whether it be the giving of our time, talent or treasure, to put God's love into action this season and when this is done, we feel God's presence as we live our faith, strengthening the belief in the answer to the question that John the Baptist posed, that yes, Jesus is the one who has come.

3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT - YEAR A 14th - 15th December 2019

Courage, do not be afraid, Your God is coming!

The joy and hope that is such a distinctive feature of the Advent season comes to the fore this week. This will be symbolised in the additional rose candle we light before our liturgies. Joy is certainly manifest in this week's readings of the Sunday. Isaiah's vision of a new creation is echoed in Jesus' response to the disciples of John the Baptiser, who ask, 'Are you the one who is to come?' Jesus replies, 'tell John the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear; the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor.'

Isaiah's vision was first proclaimed to a people in exile long before the birth of Jesus. The people had virtually lost their identity - everything that reminded them of God's faithful love for them as his chosen people - a homeland, temple and king. In the midst of their dispossession and desolation, the prophet's mission was to rekindle their hope and joy that God who would redeem and restore them

as a people.



The Gospel tells the story of John, under arrest, sending disciples to Jesus asking if he is the 'promised one' for who all have been waiting. Jesus responds by pointing to the instances of his ministry that enact the signs of salvation

proclaimed by the prophet. We can understand why John sent messengers to Jesus. When Jesus came preaching the kingdom, his vision went beyond John's words of condemnation of oppressors and call to repentance. Jesus offered unconditional forgiveness and healing for all who would receive it and befriended the lowly, the outcast and repentant as brothers and sisters. In his mission Jesus was making Isaiah's vision of a new world a reality.

This passage is a reminder that God's kingdom is already in our midst, as manifest in the life of Jesus and in a church which truly makes the mission of Jesus its mission when it embodies his justice, by extending compassion to the bruised, abused and light to those in darkness of alienation and despair.

To each of us – as disciples of the Good news - the Advent message of John: "Repent, for the kingdom is at hand", is an invitation to a change of heart and mind so that we may become bearers of joy, hope and healing to the broken, the exiled and the vulnerable in our midst.

Gaudete Sunday

Why is the third Sunday of Advent known as Gaudete

Its name is taken from the entrance antiphon of the Mass. which is:

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

This is a quotation from Philippians 4:4-5, and in Latin, the first Latin word of the antiphon is gaudete means "rejoice".

What significance does this have?


Advent is the season of preparing for the arrival of the Lord Jesus (both his first coming and his second coming), and by the third Sunday of Advent, we are most of the way through the season.
