REPENT TODAY

What is the nature of a fig tree? This is easy. A fig tree's nature




is to grow healthy and strong and bear sweet fruit. The fig tree in the Gospel is not doing so and so owner of the orchard wants to cut it down. What is the nature of a person? This is a more difficult question. Humanity was created in the image of God, given dominion over all living things, and told to be fruitful and multiply. However, humanity was given free will and soon used that to give in to temptation and disobey God. There are

two sides to human nature, for unlike a fig tree, a person has consciousness and the ability to decide how to act.

Saint Paul addresses the negative side of human nature. Many of

the Chosen People were unfaithful during their journey through the desert. He uses this incident as a lesson: the consequences are deadly to those who "desire(d) evil things." Jesus refers to the deaths of eighteen people when a tower collapsed, but he does not do so to condemn them. Rather, he uses this incident as a warning. You cannot know the hour of your death. Take the



opportunity to repent today because you may perish tomorrow. Those who were killed tragically and unexpectedly had no last minute opportunity to repent.

Our true nature as Christians is to live according to the promises we made in baptism, which we renew each year at Easter. When we fall short, repentance is the first step to reorient ourselves toward God. During Lent, in anticipation of Easter, we are called to do just that.
