Match scores are being reported fairly well this year, however it seems that each week several team captains who have not called in their scores must be tracked down. It's not really fair that the volunteers who get the standings out each week have to waste valuable time doing this, thus the 5 point penalty. Also, unreported scores can cause the standings to be mailed late or inaccurately, which is not fair to all league members. Please try to cooperate.

The league number, 254-DART, is answered by league secretary Pam Patterson, through the magic of call forwarding. Pam and husband Tom are the proprietors of Foremost Seafood. During business hours and at other times due to electronic snafus, the league number may be answered as Foremost Seafood. Please don't allow this to confuse or annoy you. Look at it as an added benefit. Where else can you report your match score and order your holiday seafood at the same time? (Foremost Seafood can also be reached at 298-1986.)

In a related matter, it should be noted that the DDA does not allow for substitutes. The league is quite liberal with allowing teams to expand 6 person rosters due to circumstances, or allowing team members to be replaced. However, these moves must be approved by the board and any new players must submit their dues the first time they shoot. Failure to do this will result in points being taken away from a team using non-league players. This is only fair to the 500 members who have paid their dues.

Don't take a chance on losing a playoff spot by using an ineligible player. Scoresheets are checked thoroughly to see that all players are league members.

What is the American Darts Organization? What can the A.D.O. do for me? The A.D.O. can do for you what you can't reasonably do for yourself or for your organization. The A.D.O. can provide:

National coordination
National advertising
Standardization of tournament rules
National/International competition
Representation on a worldwide basis

People are into darts for a variety of reasons: social fun, exhilaration of winning, the competition, even the money. Darts are organized, run, and promoted on the local level. A league or association is free to structure their leagues any way they choose, however, working at the local level limits the exposure, the prize structure and the competition, therefor creating the need for a national organization that ties the whole together.

What does all that mean in terms of you, the individual, or your club? It means the intent of the A.D.O. is to become for darts what the U.S.G.A. is for golf or the P.B.A. is for bowling.

Like anything else, there is strength in numbers. Today, the A.D.O. boasts a membership of 50,000, more than four times the total charter membership. This number is still small when one considers the number of golfers, bowlers, etc., in the U.S. It wasn't many years ago that those organizations were struggling for recognition, acceptance and membership. The day of darts is close at hand. The A.D.O. is going to speed the process.

So what's the A.D.O. doing for me the player? Actually quite a bit, and at very little cost. When our organization maintains

membership in the A.D.O., the average cost per person is about \$.50 per year...less than the cost of a glass of beer. In the next issue, we will list some of the services that the A.D.O. provides.

The A.D.O. has just celebrated its 10th anniversary. The Dayton Darting Association has been a member for six years. Our tournament last fall was sanctioned by the A.D.O. and will be on the A.D.O. Tournament calendar this year. This listing alone should increase attendance and mean a greater success for the DDA.
