

Ten posters visually describe a different style of learning. Children enjoy learning about themselves, and these posters will help them find out more about their own learning, as well as teach respect for the learning abilities of other students. If you are interested in teaching your students through multiple learning channels, these posters will also help keep you focused on providing different ways for students to access learning.

Preparation:

- 1. If you want to change the names on these posters, use the Microsoft Word ™ version. (Double click the title, and retype your new name.)
- 2. Run the posters off, single sided, on heavy white drawing paper, cover stock, or photo paper (for best results). Laminate and trim them. You can set your printer to "fast print" or "draft" mode to use less ink. Most printers produce materials that look fine on lower quality settings. Try one first to see if you are satisfied with the quality.

Ideas for Use:

- Introduce each type of learning one at a time. Have the students examine the poster and make hypotheses about the concept and how it might work.
- Present a lesson emphasizing that style of learning, and have the children comment on the experience. It will probably be easy for some of them and hard for others!
- Have the students brainstorm a list of activities that use a particular learning style.
- Have the students evaluate their own abilities in each learning modality.
- Designate "class experts" in each area.
- Duplicate a survey from a website to use with your class. You could have them take the survey online, or read it to the students and have them record their response. Score the survey as a math activity.
- Have the class dictate a summary of what they've learned about the many ways to learn. Present it to your parents in the class newsletter.
