#### The Reverend's Ruminations - December 2021

Fall has slowly fallen by the wayside, and while the final days of November have proven quite mild, as Minnesotans we do realize that the white stuff will be coming soon enough. After a year like 2020, I hope that your 2021 family Thanksgiving was a little more "normal," and that your Christmas plans this year are likewise closer to "the good ol' days," even as we make some additional considerations to keep everyone healthy. I hope that you plan to join us for worship throughout December, not only at our **5:30pm candlelight Christmas Eve service**, but in the weeks of anticipation leading up to that holy celebration. By the time you read this, the church season of Advent will already have begun on November 28, building our anticipation toward the miracle of Christmas.

As you'll notice in the newsletter calendar, on December 5<sup>th</sup>, children of all ages are invited to take part in the fun First Congo UCC tradition of building "gingerbread" houses during the Sunday School hour... a craft that has been updated to utilize toaster pastries as the building blocks for sturdier houses. The youth of our church have already begun rehearsing for their annual Christmas program, which will be presented during the morning worship service on December 19<sup>th</sup>. The adult choir will not be presenting a Christmas cantata this year, but there will likely be some great special music from the many talented singers and instrumentalists of our congregation.

Contrary to what retailers have been spouting already for weeks, "Black Friday" (which apparently needed to start even earlier this year with "Pre-Black Friday" sales) is NOT the beginning of the Advent or Christmas season. In the Christian tradition, the anticipation of the Advent season comes to light in the voice of Old Testament prophets. Jeremiah tells us, "The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will fulfill the promise I made... I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land" (33:14-15). Between the anticipation of the Messiah's birth and his execution of justice and righteousness in the land, there lies a journey—one both familiar and unknown at the same time. During the Advent season the church prepares for the coming of Christ, much like a couple preparing their own home for the arrival of a new baby. There seems so much to do: shopping, sending cards, cleaning, making guest lists, decorating, attending special concerts, baking, and even travel. But before we put the cart before the horse, perhaps we need to slow down and remember to keep Christ in Christmas.

Each of us has our own vivid memories of the excitement, anticipation, and wonder that is rolled into Advent and the celebration of Christmas. Some recall traditional family gatherings, a particular ethnic menu, a favorite gift, or even a funny mishap that made our celebration special. However, for some this is a season when the loss of a loved seems particularly poignant. If that is the case for you, I invite you to attend the **Community Blue Christmas service** that our church will be hosting this year, **Sunday December 19**<sup>th</sup> at **6:30pm**.

As the anticipation of Advent builds, God's word continues to speak through the expectation of the scriptures. The Feasting on the Word commentary series sums up the season this way:

"At Advent, God's people summon the courage and the spiritual strength to remember that the holy breaks into the daily. In tiny ways, we can open our broken hearts to the healing grace of God, who opens the way to peace... Advent is not a season for passive waiting and watching. It is a season of wailing and weeping, of opening up our lives and our souls with active anticipation and renewed hope."

Let us strive to let the holy break into our daily lives, during Advent and throughout the coming year.

Blessings to you and yours this Christmas and into 2022!





#### **CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES FOR 11-17-2021**

Members Present: Marilyn Forstrom, Abigail Roiger, Cathy Celander, Jane Kotewa, Sue Kruse, Wendy Ziemer, Kay Campe, Catherine Johnson, Larry Thompson, Dave Adams and Christina Hainy. Ex-officio members present: Dara Bliesmer, Ass't Treasurer. Robbin Celander and Pastor Germain were unable to attend.

The Council met in Heritage Hall. The meeting was called to order and was led in prayer by Moderator, Marilyn Forstrom. Minutes of the October  $20^{th}$  meeting were approved as printed. Motion M/S/C (Jane/Larry).

Treasurer's Report: Catherine presented the treasurer's report. We had \$90,812.54 in the operating funds at the end of October. Motion to receive treasurer's report was M/S/C (Wendy/Larry).

Finance/Business: Thanks to everyone who participated in the Stewardship Drive. We received 32 pledges and \$82,000 was pledged for 2022. A motion was made to move \$10,000 from the Operating Reserve to the General Account. (M/S/C Jane/Abigail) There was a motion to disband the Capital Campaign committee for this year. (M/S/C Catherine/Wendy)

Pastor's Report: Pastor Cory was absent.

#### **BOARD REPORTS:**

Christian Education: Wendy shared that on December 5<sup>th</sup>, gingerbread houses will be made during Sunday school. Pop tarts and candy donations are still needed. The Christmas program will be held on Sunday, December 19<sup>th</sup> in the basement.

Hospitality: Cathy reported that the Hospitality board did not have a meeting but have been busy baking cookies. December 3<sup>rd</sup> is the cookie tray pick-up date.

Facilities: Larry reported that gutters, landscaping in front of the storage shed, and insulation installation of the shed are done. The front sidewalk may not get done before winter. They are working on where to put the completed Blessing Box/Little Free Pantry. The next project is to add 2 railings going up to the altar on the sides.

Diaconate: Sue did not have anything to add to the written board minutes.

Missions: Kay reported that Jon Riggs was done building the Little Free Pantry (displayed in Heritage Hall). Donations covered the cost of building. They are serving cider and popcorn at the Glows Parade on Friday, November 19<sup>th</sup>. Be thinking about a month to serve the free community meal in 2022.

Worship: Dave shared that Christmas is coming, and decorating the church will occur on November 21<sup>st</sup> after church. They are also looking for more people for Pulpit Supply.

All month we will share stories of how the Christmas Fund has touched Pastors and their families over the years.





#### BEEF BURGUNDY

2 lbs. round steak, cubed

1 4 oz. can mushrooms

1 can cream of mushroom soup

1/4 c. dry red wine

1 pkg. Lipton dry onion soup mix

#### **GLAZED CARROTS**

1 two pound bag of baby carrots

2 T. butter and 2 T. brown sugar

Cook carrots to el dente stage. Add butter and brown sugar, salt and pepper.

#### SPINACH SALAD WITH WARM DIJON DRESSING

#### Dressing:

1/4 t. minced garlic 1/3 c. honey

1 1/2 t. minced onion 1/4 c. red wine vinegar

2 T. Dijon mustard 1/2 c. oil

Whisk together all but oil. Add in steady stream, whisking until emulsified.

Heat in microwave until warm.

Salad:

one lb. spinach

1/2 lb. bacon, cooked and crumbled

1 c. pecan pieces, toasted lightly

#### CRANBERRY CAKE WITH BUTTER SAUCE

3 T. butter 2 c. flour 1 c. sugar 1 c. milk

3 t. baking powder 2 c. cranberries

1/4 t. salt

Beat together all ingredients except cranberries. Fold in berries. Spread batter into 8 or 9 inch pan. Bake 35 to 40 minutes at 350. Serve warm with butter sauce.

Butter sauce: 1 c. sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$  c. cream, 1 T. flour, 1 T. vinegar,  $\frac{1}{2}$  c. butter. Mix together and heat over high heat. Add 1 t. vanilla. Serve warm.



#### **Hy-Vee and Fareway Receipts Report as of 14 November 2021**

During the last four weeks \$8,562.37 (5.70%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 16 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$62,258.17 (41.76%) toward the  $14^{th}$  \$150,000 goal.

During the same four weeks, \$9,103.94 (6.07%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 45 weeks, Fareway is at \$61,232.51 (40.42) toward our 4<sup>th</sup> \$150,000 goal.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Even slips from Hy-Vee Gas, Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church, or mailing them to me or even dropping them off at my house.

Even the very small amounts help.
