



Impact of Famotidine Use on Clinical Outcomes of Hospitalized COVID-19 Patients

Famotidine (Pepcid) in treating COVID19

Famotidine use in hospitalized patients with COVID-19 is associated with a lower risk of mortality, lower risk of combined outcome of mortality and intubation, and lower levels of serum markers for severe disease in hospitalized patients with COVID-19.

Among the many therapeutic alternatives that are currently being tested for treating patients with coronavirus (COVID-19) is the use of the histamine-2 receptor antagonist, famotidine. Following an early anecdotal report from Wuhan, China, that suggested that famotidine use was **commonly observed in COVID-19 survivors**, a retrospective cohort study of 1,620 hospitalized patients with COVID-19 demonstrated that patients receiving famotidine had statistically significant **reductions in both in-hospital death and a combined death and intubation**. More recently, a small case series of non-hospitalized patients with COVID-19 treated with high-dose oral famotidine documented a marked improvement in symptoms in all cases shortly after starting the drug...
