PLEASE NOTE!!! All mail entries must be submitted on an official AKC Agility Entry form, one dog per entry form. Envelopes/transactions containing entries for more than the 10-dog maximum shall be treated as an invalid entry. Photocopies of entry forms without the AKC agreement attached are NOT acceptable.

<u>Unsigned, incomplete, or illegible entries</u> are <u>NOT</u> acceptable and cannot be entered in the trial (AKC Agility Regulations, CH 1, Section 11). Also, to be an acceptable entry, per AKC Agility Rules, Ch 1, Section 11 **MUST INCLUDE:** Name of breeder(s), Name of Sire, and Name of Dam on every entry unless that information is unknown.

ONLINE VS PAPER ENTRY PRIMARY LIMITS: PAC is accepting online entries for this trial via the AKC's online entry service. Go to the AKC Agility Entry Services home page at <u>www.akc.org/AgilityEntry</u> and follow the instructions there to use your "My AKC" account to enter this event online. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries designated as either online or paper will be as follows: on Friday and Sunday, the online limit will be 100 entries and paper entry limit will be 250 entries. On Saturday, the online limit will be 200 entries and the paper entry limit will be 500 entries. If either form of entry (paper or online) has not filled at the end of the 48 hour time period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either one accordingly. Paper entries received within 24 hrs of the opening date and time must: (1) include postage or be metered; (2) be delivered by a multi-state or multi-national postal or carrier service, including but not limited to, USPS, FedEx, UPS, and DHL. If the above conditions are not met, the entries are not valid and will be returned to the sender; and (3) express mail must be designated as "no signature required."

Spam Filters/Email/Confirmation/Results (paper v. e-mail): If you want to receive confirmation and results via e-mail, please set your Spam Filter to accept e-mail from agiletervs@comcast.net/ The trial secretary will **NOT** go through any steps to facilitate this. Final confirmations will be mailed if no valid e-mail is provided.

MOVE UPS: Dogs may be moved up to a higher class at the request of the owner provided the request be made in writing (or by e-mail) to the Trial Secretary no later than 6:00 p.m., March 9. Requests for move-ups should include owner's name, dog's AKC number, dog's registered name, class being moved from, and class moving into. Day to day move-ups will be allowed. Move-up forms will be provided at the trial for Saturday to Sunday move-ups. The Trial Secretary must be notified of move-ups, in writing, no later than one-half hour (30 minutes) following the last run of the day on Friday and Saturday.

After the close of entries, a dog may be moved down in their class level (*i.e.*, Master to Excellent). The request for the move to the class for which the dog is eligible must be in writing and submitted to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the star of the trial (Chapter 1, Section 21 of the Agility Regulations).

Novice Move-ups: The Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 1, Section 20 states, "Dogs having attained their first AKC Agility Title (STD, JWW or FAST) must be moved to the Nov B Class (STD, JWW and FAST) for all trials." The Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 1, Section 21 states, "A dog which has been entered in a Novice "A" class for which it is not eligible to be entered in due to class restrictions on the dog or handler may be moved to the Novice "B" class. The request for the move must be in writing and presented to the trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial. The request must state the reason and justification for the move form Novice "A" class to the Novice "B" class."

AWARDS

First Place: Blue Ribbon Second Place: Red Ribbon Third Place: Yellow Ribbon Fourth Place: White Ribbon Qualifying Ribbon is a Dark Green Rosette. New Title Rosettes will be offered. Double Qualifying (from all classes): 2-streamer Rainbow Rosette, Triple Qualifying (from all classes): 3-streamer Rainbow Rosette

High in Trial: Custom embroidered fleece vest or jacket will be given out for High in Trial for runs on Saturday only, to be awarded Sunday morning in the general briefing. The highest combined score from the STD and JWW rounds for small (8" & 12"), medium (16" & 20"), and large (24" & 24C") dogs in the regular classes, and small (4", 8" & 12") and medium (16" & 20") dogs in the preferred classes, will win. Qualifying scores in both classes are required to be in contention. Scoring is based on the highest combined YPS. In case of a tie, the dog with the fastest YPS in the Standard run will win. All prizes will be awarded during the trials though HIT awards will be mailed. A rosette and jump bar will be offered to any dog completing a MACH or PACH at these trials. <u>Please notify the trial secretary if you might finish a MACH or PACH at these trials.</u>

<u>CLASSES OFFERED</u>: Please see the AKC Regulations for Agility Trials for current class descriptions. All levels of STD, JWW, FAST agility, as well as T2B, including Regular and Preferred Classes, will be offered. You may not enter the same dog in preferred and regular classes in the same set of shows (weekend). A complete set of rules for all classes is available from the American Kennel Club, 8051 Arco Corporate Drive Suite 100, Raleigh, NC 27617, or from the AKC website (<u>http://www.akc.org</u>). It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to enter their dog in the correct class. The Trial Secretary cannot make changes (except for move-ups as noted) after the closing date of the trial, regardless of who made the mistake. <u>Be sure to check your entry form carefully and make certain you have entered the correct class(es).</u>

ORDER OF CLASSES:

All Days: Ring 1: T2B, Premier Std, Exc/Mas Std, Open Std, Nov Std Ring 2: Fast Classes, Nov Jww, Open Jww, Exc/Mas Jww, Premier Jww

Ring 1 will start first and Ring 2 will start approximately a half hour after Ring 1. **NOTE** that class orders are <u>tentative</u> and a final running order will be made available after the trial has closed.

<u>CHECK IN AND START TIMES</u>: Confirmation of entry and schedule of judging will be sent to the mailing address or e-mail address (please see Spam Filter section) on the official AKC entry form. If an exhibitor has not received their confirmation or a copy of the schedule at least 7 days prior to the trials, contact the Trial Secretary. There is no formal check-in. You will need to check-in with the Gate Steward prior to your class. Judging will start no earlier than 8:00 am each day.

<u>COURSE FAMILIARIZATION</u>: Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, prior to the start of the class. ONLY handlers entered in the class will be permitted on course. There will be NO contact obstacle familiarization at these trials. A warm–up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, will be available to all exhibitors.

HEIGHT MEASUREMENTS: It is no longer required that a copy of your dog's jump height card be submitted with your entry form or show it during day of show check-in. When filling out the entry form, there is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to indicate whether your dog has a valid jump height card or if your dog needs to be measured. <u>Please check the appropriate box so the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the *Dogs To Be Measured List.* If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running; failure to do so could cause the loss of any Q's earned. If you are not sure whether your dog needs to be measured, please ask the Trial Secretary for assistance when entering! Robin Kletke is a Volunteer Measuring Official, so all dogs over age 2 that do not have a permanent height card must be measured.</u>

<u>HEIGHT DIVISION</u>: The following lists the required jump heights and minimum height for regular agility classes. Judges reserve the right to measure dogs at the trial that do not possess an official height card.

<u>OBSTACLES</u>: Please see the AKC Regulations for Agility Trials for current list of Mandatory Obstacles. Obstacles will meet the specification for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER: This trial is open to all dogs 15 months or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club, have AKC Limited Registration, are approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds, have Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), or an AKC Canine Partners listing number. Bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance are not eligible to compete. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate.

Class Changes Effective January 1, 2020

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

<u>A separate entry form **must** be submitted</u> when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend, thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

As of January 1, 2020, For Exhibition Only may be offered at the option of the host club. FEO will be offered on a 1-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is only allowed in the Time 2 Beat and FAST classes. FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Competitors must enter in T2B and/or FAST. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) (T2B and/or FAST) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.

- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring:
 - Toys must be non-audible
 - Toys may not leave the handler's hand
 - Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring.
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time

Fix and Go On (FNG)

As of January 1, 2020, Fix and Go On will be offered on a 1-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS: This trial will be held in 2 rings indoors on packed dirt. There is plenty of room for crating around the rings. Please bring chairs, crates, water, and clean up tools for your dogs. There are fast food restaurants, stores, etc. within a few miles of the show site. A food vendor is also available onsite. No propane heaters are allowed inside Clark County Fairgrounds.

The trial site will be available for set up on Thursday afternoon after 3:00 p.m. The club reserves the right to move set-ups, without notice, if space is needed for trial administration use. There is no charge for entering the fairgrounds to set up or for day-of-show parking. Day parking is on a first come, first served bases. Please park in designated parking spaces only. Do not block building entrances, fire lanes, or RV sites on the south side of the agility building.

Except when being judged or when otherwise engaged in recognized trial activity, NO DOGS OR HANDLERS (except those assisting in trial set up activities) will be allowed in the ring area from 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 12 through the completion of the trial on Sunday, March 15. <u>All dogs present during this time must be held on leash or confined except when in the ring or when in the designated agility warm up area.</u>

<u>ALL</u> dogs must be on leash at all times except when in the ring or when in the designated agility warm-up area. <u>Please clean</u> <u>up after your dogs on the show grounds and at your motel site</u>. We want to retain these facilities for future events.

Exhibitors alone are responsible for being at the ring gate when it is their turn to run. Failure to be at the ring gate could result in the exhibitor being marked absent. We will make every effort to accommodate conflicts.

<u>REFUNDS</u>: 100% of entry fees will be refunded if a written request is received by the trial secretary on or before the trial closing date. After the trial closes, a refund will be given (minus \$6.00 per run) for ill or injured dog or handler, bereavement, and/or family emergency if the trial secretary is notified before the commencement of the trial. Bitches in season will be fully refunded if the Trial Secretary is notified at least 30 minutes prior to the published commencement of each day's trial. <u>No</u> <u>refunds will be given if a request is presented after the published commencement of the trial</u>. Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

The safety of dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dog and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site.

EVENT CANCELLATION: No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

<u>DIRECTIONS TO TRIAL SITE</u>: From North or South-bound I-5, take Exit #9 (in Washington), head west on 179th for 0.5 miles, turn left onto 2nd Avenue, then left again at Gate 7 (Purple Gate). Exposition and Equestrian Bldg. is on the right, at the end of the road.

VOLUNTEERS: We need your HELP for a Successful Trial! We are counting on the generosity of agility enthusiasts to pitch in and help keep the trial running smoothly and efficiently. We will be using a white board on site to schedule workers. We will insure that your working DOES NOT interfere with your runs, so please help out. For every full class worked, exhibitors will receive a coupon that can be used towards lunch with the food vendor on site or towards future club trial entry fees.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division. All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box. Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
