Topics: Authors may submit papers on any topic relevant to cybersecurity, whether research, technical solutions, policies, educational endeavors and programs, case studies, etc.

Presentations: Authors of accepted long and short papers will present during the workshop session on September 28th and also present their work through a poster at the all-conference poster session on September 29th. Authors of accepted posters (submitted as 1-page abstracts) will attend the workshop session and present their posters at the all-conference poster session. Note: Some travel support will be available for student authors.
